Additionally we understand that the well has been spudded by virtue of permit approval from the District Supervisor and consequently we would request an expedited order be entered in this matter.

1 9 2 CROSS EXAMINATION 3 BY MR. QUINTANA: 4 Davis, the reason for the unorthodox Q Mr. location is because of an irrigation system? 5 Α Yes, sir. 6 A circular irrigation system. How does 7 that -- do you have an exhibit showing its relationship to 8 that well? 9 Ά Yes. The original -- what did we do with 10 our original -- 100 foot -- okay, we have it. 11 This is a C-102 showing our original 12 location at 100 feet from the west line, and that 100 feet from the west line actually fell right on the last stand of 13 the irrigation system, or the wheel, the last wheel that 14 pivots around the circumference, and we moved it to 145 15 feet, which would put it halfway in between the last -- the 16 last wheel. 17 MR. HALL: Do you want us 18 put this into evidence? 19 MR. OUINTANA: Yes, I want an 20 exact location as to what we have, because when we talk about an unorthodox location based on an irrigation system 21 it doesn't show anything as to what it is. 22 MR. HALL: Okay. We'd move the 23 admission of Five. 24 MR. QUINTANA: Exhibit Five

will be entered as evidence in this case.
