MR. TAYLOR: Application of

Amerind Oil Company for an unorthodox oil well location, Lea County, New Mexico.

MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, my name is Jim Bruce from the Hinkle Law Firm in Santa Fe, and I have one witness to be sworn.

MR. QUINTANA: Are there other

If not, will you please have your witness stand up and be sworn in at this time, sir?

(Witness sworn.)

ROBERT C. LEIBROCK,

being called as a witness and being duly sworn upon his oath, testified as follows, to-wit:

## DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. BRUCE:

Q Would you please state your name and city

of residence?

A My name is Robert C. Leibrock. I live in Midland, Texas.

Q What is your occupation?

A I am Vice Presidenct of Amerind Oil Company.

Q Have you previously testified before the New Mexico OCD as a petroleum engineer?

A Yes.

Q And are you familiar with Amerind's application for unorthodox location in this matter?

A Yes, uh-huh.

MR. BRUCE: Mr. Examiner, is the witness considered qualified?

MR. QUINTANA: Yes, he is. You may proceed.

Q Mr. Leibrock, would you please state for the record what Amerind seeks by its application?

A Amerind seeks an order approving an unorthodox oil well location in the High Plains Permo-Pennsylvanian Pool.

The proposed well is to be located 1650 feet from the north line, 1350 feet from the east line of Section 35, Township 114 South, Range 34 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

The northeast quarter of Section 35 is to be dedicated to the well.

Q Would you please refer to Amerind's Exhibit Number One and briefly describe this for the Examiner?

A Exhibit One is a plat and a structure map showing the proposed location and other wells in the area.

The proposed well is located in the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 35, and Amerind is the operator. The only offset operator is

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10 | Elk Oil.

The yellow designates Amerind acreage and the green is a farmout to Amerind from Texaco.

Q Has the offset operator been notified of this hearing?

A Yes, a copy of te application was sent to Elk Oil by certified mail. The return receipt is in our office and will be submitted to the OCD.

Q Would you please refer again to Exhibit

Number One and describe in more detail the proposed well and
the reasons Amerind desires to drill at this location?

A Exhibit One is a structure map contoured on top of the Saunders Lime. The proposed location is mar-

ked with a red arrow.

Amerind proposes to drill a well to an approximate depth of 10,700 feet to test the Bough C forma-

tion.

The pool rules for the proposed well require a location within 150 feet of the northeast quarter or the southwest quarter of the quarter section.

Our reason for drilling this well is to get up-dip to the Elk Oil Anderson State No. 1 in the north-west quarter of Section 36, immediately to the east of our proposed location. The Elk Anderson State Well was initially completed in the Bough C and produced about 2000 barrels of oil before watering out.

The well was then completed in the Bough A and has produced about 37,000 barrels of oil to date.

Mapping on top of the Saunders Lime indicates a strong probability that the proposed location will be high to the Elk Anderson State Well in all the Permo-Penn zones: however, in drilling the initial test well, we think it is prudent to stay as close as possible to the Elk Well because actual structural configuration is subject to a high degree of uncertainty at this time.

We are also constrained by the necessity of drilling the initial test well on the farm-in acreage from Texaco.

Therefore we think the best location for this initial well is near the eastern boundary of the Texaco acreage, as shown on the map.
