Q Will you please state your name, residence, and by whom you're employed?

A Jerry Sexton, Hobbs, New Mexico, and I'm District Supervisor for District One of the Oil Conservation Division.

Q How long have you held that position?

A Approximately ten years.

Q Have you previously testified before the Oil Conservation Division or its examiners and had your qualifications accepted?

A Yes.

A The purpose of today's case is to show why the following wells should be plugged and abandoned in accordance to Division rules: The Punch No. 1 in Unit J of 11, 12, 34; Ranger Lake No. 1 in Unit N of 11, 12, 34; Ranger Lake No. 3, Unit N of 11, 12, 34; Texas Pacific AH State No. 1 in Unit F of 14, 12, 34; and Ranger Lake SWD No. 1 in

Unit H of 15, 12, 34.

 Q Mr. Sexton, have you reviewed the files maintained for the Commission on each of these wells including the reports filed with the Commission, --

A Yes.

Q -- marked Exhibits One through Seventeen?

And would you please go through those and identify each one for us and give us an explanation, if ne-

A Yes. Exhibit Number One is just a plat showing the location of the wells.

Exhibit Number Two is a letter from the State Engineer's office showing that the area does contain fresh water, and gives the quality of the water in the area.

Exhibit Number Three are pictures showing

the conditions of the wells and that two of the wells, (not clear) and the Ranger Lake No. 1 (unclear) at the surface, and has had a stock, sheep, got into the cellar and was killed.

The other pictures are of each of the wells and they are so labeled.

So we have one other well that is leaking at the surface and this is Texas Pacific No. 1 in Unit F, 14 of 12, 34.

them show they're standing open at the surface and are in need of being plugged and abandoned and that possibly water contamination is going on at this time, plus there is a danger to livestock from the condition of that property.

Exhibit Number Four is a letter from the rancher requesting help in getting something done on these wells, either bringing them up into condition or to get them plugged and abandoned.

Exhibit Five is where we started communication, in the last series, with the operators in an attempt to get something done.

Exhibit Five is a letter to the Rapid Company stating that they need to take steps to plug and abandon the wells or bring them back into operation.

And Number Six is a letter back to Rapid.

Rapid did submit plugging procedures and were approved for by District One and we notified them that we had approved them and they had thirty days to start plugging operations.

Exhibit Number Seven is a request from Rapid for having a sixty to ninety day extension for starting the plugging of these wells.

Exhibit Number Eight is a letter from the District to Rapid stating that their sixty days would be up on October 9th and they were expected to either resume operation or we would go ahead and set the hearing to plug these wells.

Exhibit Number Nine is a letter from the Division attorney, Jeff Taylor, to -- this is a letter from the District to the attorney asking for him to set these wells for plugging.

Exhibit Number Ten is a letter from our attorney, Jeff Taylor, to Rapid Company and American Employers' Insurance Company stating that the docket has been set for hearing and letting them have their notification.

And then Exhibit Eleven through Fourteen, through Fifteen, are plugging procedures that the Division has recommended and that we will proceed with if -- if this case is decided that the wells be plugged, and they're fairly common and I don't think there's any need to go over any individual records since they will be part of the record.

Exhibit Sixteen is an inventory of the lease equipment as there is now on the lease. There is one tank battery and the pictures are referring to this that show exactly what equipment is on the lease, and this was done on October 12th of '85.

Q Excuse me, Mr. Sexton, so does this inventory relate to the pictures that we introduced as Exhibit Three A?

A Yes, they do correspond and have been marked as such.

Q Okay.

A And I would like to point out that these wells have been brought to the Commission for hearing and an order was issued. The order number was R-5734, and back in 1978, and the wells were not plugged. They were sold and produced for some time and then temporarily abandoned again for some time.

So we're bringing them back to the Commission to have them ordered replugged.

Q Thank you, and I would request the Examiner to take notice of the previous case in this matter, which was Case Number 6234 and Order Number R-5734.

MR. STOGNER: Thank you, Mr.

Taylor. I'll take administrative notice of that.

Q For each of these wells that are listed

in the docket today is it your opinion that a failure plug those wells might pose hazards to either humans livestock? 3 Α Yes. Are there any problems with any of these 5 wells that you want to point out or is the problem just generally one of potential water contamination and the ones 7 that we have pictures of which showed water on the surface of danger to livestock and humans? 9 Α Well, I think the pictures in themselves 10 substantiate that some corrective action needs to be taken 11 and it has been requested that that be done, so I think it's 12 obvious that contamination is going on and the others have 13 potential contamination possibilities but those are 14 hole. 15 Q Okay. Do you have any further testimony 16 in this matter, anything you want to present? 17 Α No, I don't. 18 Were Exhibits Numbers One through Seven-19 teen prepared by you or under your supervision or are they 20 documents and records which are kept in the normal course of 21 business or which you sent or received in the normal course 22 of business? 23 Α Yes. 24
