APPLICATION

(C.J.C. S. 146)

The Applicant, JACK J. GRYNBERG, hereby requests an Order pooling all mineral interests from the surface to the base of the Morrow formation underlying the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 25, Township 18 South, Range 26 East, Eddy County, New Mexico to form a standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit to be dedicated to a well to be drilled at a standard location thereon. In support of this application it is further stated.

1) Pursuant to and in harmony with the Oil and Gas Act Section 70-2-17, the Applicant desires to obtain an order from the Commission declaring the following described acreage as a 320-acre gas spacing, and proration unit;

Township 18 South -- Range 26 East
Section 25: S $\frac{1}{2}$
Containing 320.00 acres, more or less
Eddy County, New Mexico

2) Applicant further seeks an order pooling all mineral interests from the surface to the base of the Morrow formation underlying the proposed 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit.

3) Applicant is the holder of federal lease, NM 54328 covering 19.93 acres of the proposed unit.

4) Applicant asks to be designated as operator of the unit and of a well to be located at a standard location thereon. Said well will be drilled to a depth sufficient to test the Morrow formation, approximately 9,600 feet.

5) There are interest owners in the proposed proration unit who have not agreed to voluntarily pool their interests.

6) The establishment of this 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit and the pooling of all mineral interests within said unit, is necessary to avoid the drilling of unnecessary wells, to protect correlative rights, to prevent waste and to afford the owner of each interest in said unit the opportunity to recover or receive without unnecessary expense his just and fair share of the hydrocarbons underlying the proposed spacing and proration unit.

WHEREFORE, the Applicant requests the Commission set this matter down for a hearing before an Examiner at the earliest possible date, give notice as required by law and after hearing, enter its Order;

- A) Establishing the 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit;
- B) pooling all mineral interests within said unit as outlined above;
