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LOUIS J. MAZZULLO,

being called as a witness and having been previously sworr upon his oath, testified as follows, to-wit:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

6 BY MR. CARR:

Q Mr. Mazzullo, are you familiar with the application filed in this case?

A Yes, I am.

Q And are you familiar with the subject well?

A Uh-huh, yes, I am.

Q What does Nearburg Producing Company seek in this case?

A Nearburg Producing Company seeks approval for an unorthodox gas well location for its No. 1-Y Rett Federal, which is located in Section 23 of Township 20 South, 34 East, in Lea County.

Q Would you refer to what has been marked as Nearburg Exhibit Number One, identify this, and review it for the Examiner?

A Nearburg Exhibit Number One is a location plat which shows the location of the subject well by the red solid triangle. A laydown 320-acre proration unit dedicated to that well as a Morrow well, and the offset operators, im

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1 mediately adjacent to the well. 2 Mr. Mazzullo, what is the primary objec-3 tive in the well? The primary objective of the well Δ 5 Nearburg was the Morrow formation. Q And what would be a standard location for 7 this laydown unit for a Morrow well? 8 Α A Morrow well would require 660 feet from the south line and 1980 feet from the east line. 9 10 What is the actual well location? 11 Α The actual well location is 660 feet south and 760 feet east. 12 13 Could you provide the Examiner with some 14 background on the well and summarize the events which have 15 resulted in today's hearing? 16 Α Yes. This well was a re-entry of an old 17 Shell well, the Shell No. 1 Sinclair Federal, which was 18 drilled several years ago and abandoned as a Bone Spring 19 So it was standard as -- it was on a standard loca-20 tion for a Bone Spring test. 21 Earlier last year Nearburg, or at the

Earlier last year Nearburg, or at the time Chama Petroleum Company, came in and re-entered the old wellbore and attempted to clean it out.

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When they failed in their re-entry attempt on the old wellbore, they were -- they were given BLM approval to skid the rig westward 100 feet and we drilled a new well down to the Morrow formation, which we completed on June the 8th, 1984 -- which we spudded on June the 8th, 1985. I'm sorry.

The request for an allowable was filed on Division Form C-104 and is being held pending approval of this location.

Q Mr. Mazzullo, the re-entry was approved by Oil Conservation Division Order R-7834, was it not?

A Yes, it was.

11 Q And that was entered on February 26th,

12 | 1985?

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A Yes, it was.

14 Q No approval has been received on the C-

15 | 104.

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A None yet.

17 Q Would you now go to Nearburg Exhibit Num18 ber Two and review that for Mr. Stogner?

A Nearburg Exhibit Number Two is the original geologic map prepared by myself which highlights the primary Morrow sand objective in the original re-entry attempt. It shows the reason why we wanted to re-enter the wellbore at a nonstandard location. As you well know, the Morrow is a pretty tricky formation to try to pinpoint and on the basis of this sand Isopach of the primary pay zone in

the area, I felt that a location as close to the east line
of Section 23 would be the optimum geological location for a
successful well.

If we were to move it any -- to a standard location 1980 feet to the east -- to the -- from the
east, I felt like the well would not be successful.

Now at this time is this well a -- being

Q Now at this time is this well a -- being completed in a single zone or are you dually completing the well?

A At the time -- at this time the well has been completed in the Morrow and we are testing up-hole potential in the Bone Spring.

Q But the well is at a standard location in the Bone Spring.

A It's at a standard location in the Bone Spring.

17 Q Would you identify what has been marked 18 as Nearburg Exhibit Number Three?

A Nearburg Exhibit Number Three are notices correctly sent to all the offset operators with the appropriate return receipts validated informing them of this application.

Q Is the location of the well as depicted on this exhibit correctly set forth?

A Yes, it is.

1 Q And have you checked that and know 2 of your own personal knowledge? 3 Α Yes, I did. And this notice has been sent by certified 5 mail in accordance with Rule 1207 of the Oil Conservation Division rules and regulations. 7 Α It has, and all the offset operators have 8 responded. 9 Mr. Mazzullo, in your opinion will granting this application be in the best interest of conserva-10 11 tion, the prevention of waste, and the protection of correlative rights? 12 13 Α Yes, I do. 14 MR. CARR: At this time --15 Were Exhibits One through Three prepared Q 16 by you or compiled under your direction and supervision? 17 Α Yes, they were. 18 MR. CARR: At this time, Mr. 19 Stogner, we would offer into evidence Nearburg Exhibits One 20 through Three. 21 MR. STOGNER: Exhibits One 22 through Three will be admitted into evidence at this time. 23 MR. CARR: And that concludes 24 my direct examination of Mr. Mazzullo. 25

CROSS EXAMINATION

2 | BY MR. STOGNER:

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Q Mr. Mazzullo, is this production in the Morrow, would that be dedicated to any particular pool or is this considered a wildcat area?

A This is a wildcat area. By a prior Division Order Nearburg and Chama had limited -- had gotten a limitation of the pool rules of the Lea South Field, which is the offsetting field, to the Section line between 23 and 24. Those wells were drilled on 160-acre spacings and the Rett Federal was dedicated -- 320-acre spacing was dedicated to the Rett Federal.

MR. CARR: Mr. Stogner, I believe that the limitation of the Lea Penn Pool was also addressed in Order R-7834, which was dated February 26th of 1985.

MR. STOGNER: 1985?

MR. CARR: Yes, sir.

MR. STOGNER: Thank you, Mr.

Carr. I'll take administrative notice of Order R-7834.

And I have no questions for

this witness.
