1 MR. STOGNER: You may be 2 seated. 3 Mr. Taylor? 5 JERRY SEXTON, being called as a witness and being duly sworn upon his 7 oath, testified as follows, to-wit: 8 DIRECT EXAMINATION 10 BY MR. TAYLOR: 11 0 Would you please state your name, occupa-12 tion, and place of employment? 13 Jerry Sexton and I'm District Supervisor Α 14 at the Hobbs District I office. 15 And does District I include that area in 16 Lea County, in which the site of the treating plant in this 17 matter is located? 18 Α Yes, it does. 19 And are you familiar with the matters in-20 volved in Casxe 8983? 21 Α Yes. 22 MR. TAYLOR: Mr. Examiner, I 23 tender the witness as an expert. 24 MR. STOGNER: Mr. Sexton is so 25 qualified.

Q Mr. Sexton, would you please tell us the purpose of this case?

Oil Processing as a treating plant is now out of business and they've left a bunch of, oh, solid oilfield waste material on the surface down there, as well as some buried tanks which need to be cleaned up and disposed of in a proper manner to keep the environment and prevent any possibly pollution of the fresh water occurring at a future date.

Since they are out of business and the bond is available, we recommend that the Oil Conservation Division do this and attempt to clean up the area.

Q Do you have any exhibits --

A Yes, I --

0 -- to introduce in this case?

A I have a series of pictures that we have taken and it shows the -- somewhat to the extent of material left at location.

It also shows the tanks were sold at a Sheriff's sale, so we won't actually do any of the work until the tanks have been removed. They're supposed to be removed in the -- sometime this month, and then we'll propose to get bids and dispose of the solid oil material on the surface and level and clean up the location.

Q Would you please go through each of your

1 exhibits, describe it, and explain what it depicts? 2 Exhibit One-A is a picture showing 3 tanks that are left on location and the mess that will available when the tanks are moved. 5 Exhibit One-B is a different view of 6 same and some of the different tanks. I think at one time 7 it was seventeen tanks on location. Exhibit One-C is a -- shows a picture buried tanks plus solid waste plus there's junk material 10 consisting of barrels and other stuff. 11 Pictures One-D, One-E, and One-F all show 12 the degree and the amount of solid oilfield waste that will 13 ahve to be disposed of. This company brought in, oh, num-14 erous dumptruck loads from Texas with the idea of reclaiming 15 it and dumped it on the surface of the ground. 16 So we're proposing to dispose of it. 17 Do these photographs labeled Exhibits 18 One-A through F accurately depict the circumstances on the 19 site in this case? 20 Α Yes. 21 MR. TAYLOR: We'd tender Exhi-22 bits One-A through F. 23 MR. STOGNER: Exhibits One-A

through One-F will be admitted into evidence at this time.

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1 to the former operators of this location? He's left Hobbs and my understanding, 3 don't think anyone's been able to get hold of him and for this reason they had a Sheriff's sale. I don't believe 5 went into bankruptcy, it was just a dissolving of the business. 7 Q Was an effort made by the Division 8 give notice to the owners of the site and their insurance 9 agency? 10 Yes. We've written them and their bon-11 ding company in an attempt to locate and to inform them on 12 what's going on. 13 MR. TAYLOR: And, Mr. Examiner, 14 if you desire, label the notices as Exhibit Two, and 15 we can just staple that and the return receipt cards to-16 gether. 17 And so, Mr. Sexton, the situation is that 18 because of the Sheriff's sale a large amount of the equip-19 ment will be removed from the site but we will still need to 20 forfeit the bond in order to reclaim the site. 21

1 in this case, Mr. Examiner. MR. STOGNER: Do you wish Exhi-3 bit Two to be admitted into evidence? MR. TAYLOR: Yeah, those -- as 5 a record of the Division. MR. STOGNER: Exhibit Two will 7 be admitted into evidence at this time. 8 9 CROSS EXAMINATION 10 BY MR. STOGNER: 11 Mr. Sexton, about what time or how long 0 12 ago did this owner leave town or disappear or stop his oper-13 ation? 14 Oh, I estimate about a year but this Α 15 -- this problem is one that comes up in a series. You know, 16 he was in operation for awhile, but it was hard to tell. 17 was still around; then he moved off the equipment he could 18 salvage, and they had the Sheriff's sale. I would say prob-19 ably a year. 20 Who is the owner that we refer to? 0 21 Α Thurman Smith is the owner. 22 Has there been any trace of him, where 23 he's at today? 24 No, I don't think -- we haven't been able Α 25 to contact him and I don't think the others in Hobbs have.

1 Okay. The series of photographs, Q about 2 when were they taken? 3 Within the last, oh, two or three weeks. Α Picture One-A and One-B show a series of 5 Are they empty or do they have anything in them? 6 They're -- partially both. Α They were 7 sold as were by the Sheriff and they were given a month to 8 empty and remove the tanks from the land. 9 Do you know who bought the tanks? 10 That would vary. There was probably as 11 many as seven or eight different buyers. 12 0 Okay, on Exhibit One-C I show looks like 13 a pit full of solid garbage, trash barrels, paper, a hard 14 hat, plastic. Will that hauled away and dumped somewhere or 15 will it just be buried? 16 It will depend on what we have available 17 at the time. If we bury a lot of it we'll just bury that on 18 location. If we move, remove the other, we'll probably re-19 move that. 20 On my last three series of photographs, 0 21 One-D. as in dog, E, and F, show it looks like several 22 mounds of black dirt. What is -- what is that made up of? 23 That was obtained from Kilgore, Texas, 24 and it was to be reclaimed but I think the contents were not 25 such that it -- you could reclaim it economically, so if

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1 there's nothing dangerous in it we could probably use it for 2 road material, some company; if not, we'll probably bury it 3 or take it to one of our approved disposal sites. Have you received any correspondence from 5 Travelers Insurance Company other than this August letter that's in my file folder here? 7 No, I haven't been in contact with them. Α 8 MR. STOGNER: Are there 9 other questions of Mr. Sexton? 10 If not, he may be excused. 11 Mr. Taylor, do you have 12 anything further in this case? 13 MR. TAYLOR: No, Mr. Examiner, 14 that's it. 15 MR.
