Dear Mr. Westbrook:

Your application dated August 6, 1986 for hardship classification of the captioned well and Mr. Sexton's response of August 8 have been received in this office. Your case has been set for hearing by examiner October 8 in Santa Fe.

In the interim, it is suggested that you be prepared to present evidence on the following points:

- 1) The liquid gravity and gas-oil ratio. may be able to classify the well as an oil well, and the casinghead gas would then carry a priority second only to the hardship gas.
- The mechanical integrity of the well. A 2) casing leak is suspected because of the sudden water entry.
- 3) The minimum flow rate which would prevent permanent damage or loss of reserves producible from the well and reservoir. is suggested you schedule a minimum flow rate test with our Hobbs District Office.

Application of Zia Energy, Inc. for a non-standard gas proration unit, unorthodox gas well location, and simultaneous dedication, Lea County, New Mexico. Applicant, in the above-styled cause, seeks approval of a 240-acre non-standard gas spacing and proration unit comprising the E/2 NW/4, SW/4 NW/4, N/2 SW/4, and SE/4 SW/4 of Section 20, Township 22 South, Range 36 East, Jalmat Gas Pool, to be simultaneously dedicated to its Cities Federal Well No. 3 located at an unorthodox gas well location 330 feet from the North line and 2310 from the West line (Unit C) of said Section 20 and to its Cities Federal Well No. 4 located at a standard location 1650 feet from the North line and 2310 feet from the West line (Unit F) of said Section 20.
