

UNION OIL COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA d/b/a UNOCAL, by its undersigned attorneys, hereby makes application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division for approval for downhole commingling of production from the Gallup and Dakota formations, under certain lands in Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, and in support thereof shows:

1. Applicant operates the Rincon Unit which includes Sections 1 and 2, Township 26 North, Range 7 West, N.M.P.M., Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

2. Applicant seeks approval for downhole commingling of production from the Gallup formation, Largo-Gallup Gas Pool and the Dakota formation, Basin Dakota Gas Pool, in the wellbore of any well located in said acreage.

3. Granting this application will result in the increased recovery of hydrocarbons and will not damage the subject formations.


4. Granting this application will be in the best interest of conservation, the prevention of waste and the protection of correlative rights.
