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3 1 2 STAMETS: We'll call next MR. 3 8240, which is in the matter of the hearing called by Case 4 the Oil Conservation Division on its own motion to consider 5 the rescission of Order Number R-2788. 6 MR. PEARCE: May it please the 7 Examiner, I am W. Perry Pearce, appearing in this matter on 8 behalf of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division. 9 I have one witness who needs to be sworn. 10 MR. STAMETS: Any other appear-11 ances in this case? 12 13 (Witness sworn.) 14 15 LESLIE CLEMENTS, 16 being called as a witness and being duly sworn upon his 17 oath, testified as follows, to-wit: 18 DIRECT EXAMINATION 19 BY MR. PEARCE: 20 Thank you, sir. For the record would you 0 21 please state your name, your employer and position of em-22 ployment? 23 А Leslie Clements. Supervisor District 24 New Mexico Oil Conservation Division in Artesia, Two. New 25 Mexico.

1 4 Mr. Clements, how long have you worked 0 2 for the Oil Conservation Division? 3 Twenty-four years and nine months. Ά 4 And is that area affected by Order R-2788 0 5 within your area of responsibility in that district? 6 Yes, sir. Α 7 Mr. Clements, to speed this proceeding a-0 8 long, I'm going to ask that you take the packet of exhibits 9 which you have prepared and briefly run through those exhi-10 bits, commenting on each for the Examiner and those in attendance at this hearing, and as you go through, if you 11 would please briefly describe what the Division seeks in 12 this matter. 13 А Okay. The exhibits I have prepared here 14 begins with what I have marked as OCD Exhibit Number One, 15 which is a letter that I wrote Deanie Lou on June the 7th, 16 198 - -17 Anyway, I wrote this letter to them 18 directing them to cease putting water in a pit and that we were going to set this matter for a show cause hearing why 19 Order 2788 should not be rescinded and thereafter all waters 20 be handled under Division Rule R-3221. 21 And as I understand it, sir, for the re-0 22 in this proceeding, that disposal pit operated by cord 23 Deanie Lou is now covered by the provisions of R-2788. 24 А That is right. 25 All right, sir, would you please proceed? Q

5 1 Exhibit Two is just a copy of Order Α R-2 issued back on the 21st day of October, which 2788, was 3 1964. 4 It states that prior to use that these 5 pits will be inspected by the State Engineer's Office out of 6 Roswell and in checking with the State Engineer's Office in 7 Roswell, they informed me that they had never inspected any pits in the area covered by this order. 8 As to the disposal and pit proce-0 Okay. 9 dures, sir, what does Order R-2788 provide? 10 It provides for two townships, Township 6 А 11 and 7 South, Range 26 East, Chaves County, New Mexico, that 12 they are allowed to pit waters within two miles of the Pecos 13 River and in a lined pit, I'm sorry. 14 All right, sir, and is there some provi-0 15 sion for how that lined pit is to be constructed? 16 Yes, sir. A 0 Thank you, go ahead, please. 17 The next exhibit I have, Α Okay. I have 18 marked as OCD Exhibit Number Three-A. It's just a cover, a 19 xeroxed corner of a quadrangle map and I have included it 20 only to show what quadrangle map that I have presented as 21 Exhibit marked OCD Exhibit Three-B. 22 This exhibit was submitted to show that 23 the pit sets upon the left or the west bank, I'm sorry, of 24 the Pecos River, some -- about a half a mile or three-quarters of a mile away from the Peco River, and to show the 25

1 6 terrain of this part of the country drops off real rapidly 2 towards the Pecos River; therefore it would cause a natural 3 drainage into the springs and the river itself. 4 All right, sir. While we have Exhibit 0 5 Three, Three-B before us, are there other disposal facili-6 ties of which you're aware which are currently regulated by 7 the provision of R-2788? 8 Yes, sir. Yates Petroleum Company oper-А 9 ates a salt water disposal well in Unit -- or Section 36. Okay, any other pit? 0 10 Yes, sir. А There is a pit on the east 11 side of the river in Section 28. 12 All right, sir, please go ahead. Q 13 OCD Exhibit Number Four А Okay. is а 14 sample or analysis of a sample taken by Mr. Weaver on May 15 the 4th, 1984, and run by Mr. Brooks of our office to show 16 that chlorides was 127,350 parts per million. 17 0 Okay. 18 А Okay, Exhibit Number Five is a field trip Williams, which I was along that day that we report by Mr. 19 -- that he went there and it's intended to show that Penroc 20 Oil Company has a line laid from their lease to this -- it 21 is to show that there is a water line from Penroc Oil Com-22 pany's lease to the England Federal battery operated by 23 Deanie Lou. 24 And the England Fedral battery operated 0 25 by Deanie Lou is the pit in question.

1 7 Yes, sir. Α 2 Thank you, sir. 0 3 The following exhibits marked OCD Six-A А 4 through Six-E are field reports of Mr. B. W. Weaver taken at 5 random dates that are submitted just to show the condition 6 of this pit. 7 Okay, Mr. Clements, you mentioned that 0 8 there was another pit operated in Section 28 under the pro-9 visions of this order. Is it fair to say that field -- a collec-10 tion of field trip reports to that facility would show sub-11 stantially the same types of problems encountered at this 12 operation? 13 Yes, sir. А 14 All right, sir, thank you. Go ahead with 0 15 Seven, please. 16 Okay. OCD Exhibit Number Seven is a copy А 17 of the latest C-115 submitted to us by Deanie Lou. Ιt is intended to show what production, or water production that 18 they are indicating, which seems to be some discrepancy ac-19 cording to their pumper. 20 They show somewhere around one barrel a 21 on their C-115 and their pumper claims that they're day 22 making at least eight barrels per well. 23 0 Okay. In your opinion the amount of 24 water that is collected in this pit at the present time, 25 would that be possible if those wells were only producing a

1 8 barrel a day? 2 Α No, sir. 3 0 Okay, thank you, sir. Please proceed. 4 А Okay. The next exhibit is marked OCD 5 Number Eight, and it is the latest C-115 from Penroc Oil 6 Corporation to show that -- the amount of water that they 7 are also putting in this pit. 8 The Cooper Lease shows, or indicates, 806 9 per month and the Elliott Federal 725 barrels barrels per month. 10 Okay, and those -- those volumes are more 0 11 in line with what you would expect judging by the volume 12 contained in the pit at the present time? 13 Yes, sir. А 14 All right, sir, please go ahead 0 with 15 Nine. 16 А OCD Nine is just a page from the 17 Engineering Committee stat book, Volume 1-A, page 329, 1983, and it's some general information as the reported volumes 18 for the year of 1983. 19 Clements, in this case the Oil Con-0 Mr. 20 servation Division is requesting that Order R-2788 be 21 rescinded and that the disposal provisions of R-3221 be made 22 appicable to the area previously covered by the rescinded 23 order. 24 Would you briefly describe for the Exami-25 the difference in disposal procedures between those two ner

9 1 orders? 2 The procedures under R-2788 did not А in-3 clude any leak protection devices for any lined pits. It 4 only to be inspected by the State Engineers, which Ι was 5 have stated before was not inspected by the State Engineers. 6 Division Order R-3221 requires that any 7 volumes of water over one barrel per day be properly disposed of either in a disposal well or in a lined pit 8 that has proper leak protection devices under the provisions of 9 R-3221-C. 10 is my recommendation that this Order It 11 R-2788 be abolished and the waters handled under the provi-12 sions as provided by R-3120. 13 Clements, in your opinion will the 0 Mr. 14 disposal procedures specified under R-3221 better protect 15 the surface and underground waters within the State of New Mexico from contamination of the waters in questions? 16 А Yes, sir. 17 And do you believe that if Order 2788 is 0 18 rescinded that you have the authority and the ability to get 19 the operator of this facility to properly clean and dispose 20 of the fluids presently on site? 21 Yes, sir. А 22 Thank you, sir. 0 23 MR. PEARCE: Mr. Examiner, I 24 have nothing further on direct at this time. would move the admission of 25 Ι

1 10 OCD Exhibits One through Nine. 2 MR. STAMETS: The exhibits will 3 be admitted. 4 5 CROSS EXAMINATION 6 BY MR. STAMETS: 7 Q Mr. Clements, are there some lined pits 8 in this area now as a result of this original order? 9 А Yes, sir. How many are there? 10 0 А Two. 11 And who are the owners? 0 12 А Okay, Deanie Lou owns this one that we 13 were talking about here, and the other one is owned by --14 just a minute, I've got that wrote down here somewhere. 15 MR. PEARCE: If I may, Mr. Exa-16 miner, I believe the name of the company is Nichols and 17 Brady, B-R-A-D-Y. 18 А Yes. Q Would it be your recommendation that 19 those lined pits be dug up, carted off, the area leveled and 20 returned to its natural condition? 21 А Yes, sir. 22 It should be allowed to be dried and then 0 23 the material removed. 24 In the letter I wrote to Deanie Lou I re-А 25 quested them to haul this water to a proper disposal system

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2	that was in the pit because the pit lining is nonexistent in
3	some places.
