In previous correspondence dated January 15, 1985 Lynx Petroleum offered Texaco an offer to participate in a Queen completion in the referenced well or farmout your acreage. Your letter dated March 28, 1985 stated Texaco was not interested under the terms as outlined.

Lynx Petroleum is now requesting a farmout on Texaco's acreage covering the S/2 SW/4 Section 25, T-16S, R-36E, Lea County, New Mexico from surface to 4100'. This acreage would be included in a 160 acre proration unit to be dedecated to a Queen zone in the Geraldine Doughty #1. Lynx Petroleum is offering the following terms:

- 1) Texaco would deliver a 75% net lease to Lynx and retain an option to convert any overriding royalty to a 25% WI at payout.
- 2) Lynx would commence recompletion operations on the Geraldine Doughty to test the Queen horizion within 120 days of a signed agreement. If the test is successful, Lynx would earn all rights from surface to 4100'.
