I've practiced law in New Mexico for 25, 26 years; also worked as an oil and gas lawyer, and in this particular instance I've been the operator of the wells that have been drilled here through my company, which is Petroleum Exploration Company.

have drilled out here on a considerable amount of geology and if you hit the fracture, then you get a high level of production. This is San Andres production, and this is a fractured area. When I hit the fracture, I get adequate production.

On the survey plat there I showed in the southwest of the northeast of this section, I

drilled that 2-Y, hit the fracture, we got lots of torque and bouncing, and we got a very, very good well.

Sun Oil Company east of me drilled a well in the northwest northwest of Section 16. They hit the fracture. They got a good well.

I moved up the northwest of the northeast on that No. 4, missed the fracture, did not complete it in dolomite and did not get a good well.

Same thing happened on three.

We have been able to touch it

over farther west.

Now, working from surface geology and not using -- I've got plenty of geological reports -- we've located that fracture as being down, just working strictly from surface geology, as being 1073 feet from the north line. That's crowding my quarter quarter section there by 83 feet, so this is an unorthodox location of 83 feet.

I've had the surveyor back.

I've had the surface geologist back, trying to get it 990,
and they say, no, you're going to miss the fracture if you
do.

And that's all I have. I just need to drill down there.

MR. SOLSBERY: That's just due

north of Section 17, yes, sir.

MR. CATANACH: Okay, and they had no objection to your location?

MR. SOLSBERY: Well, the letter came back. It was signed December 4. It was delivered to them on December 4.

MR. CATANACH: Okay, and the 40

## ORDER OF THE DIVISION

#### BY THE DIVISION:

This cause came on for hearing at 8:15 a.m. on January 9, 1986, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner David R. Catanach.

NOW, on this 16th day of January, 1986, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

#### FINDS THAT:

- (1) Due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) The applicant, Petroleum Exploration Company, Inc., seeks approval of an unorthodox oil well location 1073 feet from the North line and 2023 feet from the East line of Section 17, Township 8 South, Range 31 East, NMPM, Siete-San Andres Pool, Chaves County, New Mexico.
- (3) The NW/4 NE/4 of said Section 17 is to be dedicated to the well.
- (4) A well at said unorthodox location will better enable applicant to produce the oil underlying the proration unit.
- (5) No offset operator objected to the proposed unorthodox location.
- (6) Approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the oil in the affected pool, will prevent the

economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

- (1) The application of Petroleum Exploration Company, Inc. for an unorthodox oil well location for the San Andres formation is hereby approved for a well to be located 1073 feet from the North line and 2023 feet from the East line of Section 17, Township 8 South, Pange 31 East, NMPM, Chaves County, New Mexico.
- (2) The NW/4 NE/4 of said Section 17 shall be dedicated to the above-described well.
- (3) Jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
