THE APPLICATION OF MAGNOLIA PETROLEUM COMPANY FOR AN ORDER OF APPROVAL OF PROPOSED UNIT AGRELMENT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATION OF THE LINDRITH UNIT AREA DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS: COVERING 28,499.41 ACRES SITUATED IN TOWNSHIPS 24 AND 25 NORTH, RANGES 2 AND 3 WEST, N.M.P.M. IN RIO ARRIBA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 10:00 o'clock a.m., October 28, 1948, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission."

NOW, on this 19th day of November, 1943, the Commission having before it for consideration the testimony adduced at the hearing of said case and being fully advised in the premises:

FRES that the proposed unit plan will in principle tend to promote the conservation of oil and gas and the prevention of waste;

IT IS THEFEFORE ORDERED:

That the order herein shall be known as the:

"LINDRICH UNIT ACREEMENT ORDER"

- SECTION 1. (a) That the project herein shall be known as the Lindrith Unit Agreement and shall hereafter be referred to as the Project.
- (b) That the plan by which the Project shall be operated shall be embraced in the form of unit agreement for the development and operation of the Lindrith Unit Area referred to in the Petitioner's petition and filed with said petition and such plan shall be known as the Lindrith Unit Agreement Plan.
- SECTION 2. That the Lindrith Unit Agreement Plan shall be and is hereby approved in principle as a proper conservation measure; provided, however, that notwithstanding any of the provisions contained in said unit agreement, this approval of said agreement shall not be considered as waiving or relinquishing in any manner any rights, duties, or obligations which are now or may hereafter be vested in the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission by law relative to the supervision and control of operations for exploration and development of any lands committed to said Lindrith Unit Agreement or relative to the production of oil or gas therefrom.

SECTION 3. (a) That the Unit Area shall be:

(b) The Unit Area may be enlarged or diminished as provided in said Plan.

SECTION 4. That the unit operator shall file with the Commission an executed original or executed counterparts thereof of the Lindrith Unit Agreement not later than 30 days after the effective date hereof.

SECTION 5. That any party owning rights in the unitised substances who does not commit such rights to said Unit Agreement before the effective date thereof may thereafter become a party thereto by subscribing to such agreement or a counterpart thereof. The Unit Operator shall file with the Commission within 30 days an original or any such counterpart.

SLCTION 6. That this order shall become effective on the first day of the calendar month next following the approval of the Commissioner of Public Lands and the Secretary of the Interior, and shall terminate ipso facts on the termination of said Unit Agreement. The last Unit Operator shall immediately notify the Commission in writing of such termination.
