Dear Sir:

I have been requested to summarize the views expressed by me in the "Engineering Report" which was attached as "Exhibit 'B'" to Skelly Oil Company's "Geological and Engineering Report, Huerfanito Area, San Juan County, New Mexico", dated and transmitted to your office on June 23, 1955. Furthermore, I should like to reiterate my opinion as to the practicability, from an engineering standpoint, of using pressure data as the sole criterion for the delineation of a separate pool or deposit within captioned unit. In brief, my report stated the following conclusions:

- 1. There is no existing evidence which would prove conclusively that the Pictured Cliffs gas wells in the South portion of captioned unit area are producing from a reservoir separate from those in the North portion of said area.
- 2. There is no factual basis for the statement contained in Article III, at page 3 of Mr. Greer's Engineering Report of May 15, 1955, to the effect that ". . . the fact that Pictured Cliffs wells are producing from different reservoirs is evidenced by the difference in initial shut-in pressures of the wells".
- 3. There is no factual basis for Mr. Greer's statement contained in the same Article, at page 5 thereof, that a pressure differential of fifty (50) psig ". . . establishes the fact that an impermeable barrier

lies between the Ballard Field reservoir in the south part of the Huerfanito Unit and the wells completed in Participating Area No. 1". (At page 2, my report states: "We are of the opinion that it is inconceivable from a scientific standpoint that a definite conclusion as to reservoir separation in a reservoir with physical characteristics such as are found in the Pictured Cliffs formation in this area could be made on the basis of the difference of only 50 psig in the initial shut-in pressure on wells seven miles apart.")

4. There being a magnitude of factors adversely affecting the accuracy of initial shut-in pressures which far exceeds the magnitude of some of those factors adversely affecting the accuracy of seven day shut-in pressures, seven day shut-in pressures rather than initial shut-in pressures should be used whenever pressure data is required by the United States Geological Survey in the solution of a problem of this nature.

If we can assume that it is necessary to use some kind of pressure data to solve this problem, I believe most engineers would agree that the most theoretically perfect data available would be obtained from taking stabilized reservoir pressures. However, in this reservoir, and certainly in other reservoirs having comparable physical characteristics, the use of stabilized reservoir pressure data is demonstrably impractical for the following reasons:

- 1. <u>Shut-in time factor</u>, i.e., that length of time required for any given well to reach a pressure which may be said to be "stabilized". In general field practice, a commercial gas well is put on the line as soon as a market for the gas is available rather than being shut-in for a time sufficiently long for it to reach a stabilized pressure. In view of this practice, it is very unlikely that stabilized pressure data will be readily available in substantial quantity in most similar instances.
- 2. Well completion date factor: For example, note that the wells in the Northern portion of captioned unit were completed during the

period from February to December, 1953, while the first well drilled in the Southern portion of said unit was not completed until November, 1954 (one year after the completion date of the last well drilled in the Northern portion). Pressure data which was obtained from these wells was not - and could not have been - taken at the same time and, therefore, is not subject to valid comparison.

3. Practical aspect factor: Because the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico requires by order the taking of annual deliverability and seven day shut-in pressure tests at the same time, data thus obtained is readily available in the files of the Commission and provides a standard or yardstick by which to compare and contrast all wells so tested. This, among other data, is used in the proration formula established by the Commission for use in prorated fields in this area. (Attached hereto please find a copy of Order No. R-333-C and D, which is the most recent order pertaining to gas well testing procedure applicable to gas wells completed in San Juan County, New Mexico; I have indicated in red those portions of this order which I deem to be applicable to our problem).

My stated opinion in my report was, and I reiterate it here, that if pressure data must be used to the exclusion of all other factors in determining whether or not a separate participating area should be created within captioned unit area, then the results obtained from seven day shutin pressures would provide the most readily available and practically obtainable data for use in making any such determination. Although quick to concede the theoretical soundness of stabilized reservoir pressure data, I cannot recommend its use for the reasons above expressed.

Enclosed please find transcripts of proceedings in the two hearings before the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico which involved, among other areas, the Huerfanito Unit. For your convenience in examining these Ltr., Mr. H. J. Duncan, 12/9/55, p. 4

transcripts, I have indicated those pages which encompass the bulk of the testimony respecting pressure data.
