Well No. 2 was completed in the Pennsylvanian Formation at a location described as SW/4 NE/4 Section 34, T-18-S, R-31-E, and a Pennsylvanian Participating Area comprising 1440 acres has been approved. Well No. 3 is presently completed in the Siluro-Devonian Formation at a location described as the SE/4 NE/4 Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E, which is outside the present limits of the Siluro-Devonian Participating Area. An application for expansion of the existing Siluro-Devonian Participating Area to include the NW/4 of Section 26 and the NE/4 of Section 27 in T-18-S, R-31-E has been filed but approval of that expansion has not yet been granted.

Unit Well No. 4, located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E, was completed in the Cherry Canyon Formation January 30, 1959. Unit Well No. 5, located in the SE/4 NW/4 of Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E, was dry in the Cherry Canyon Formation and completion attempts were abandoned in July, 1959. Continental Oil Company is, at last report, attempting to complete a well located in the SW/4 SE/4 of Section 26, T-18-S, R-31-E in the Pennsylvanian Formation. This well is being drilled under the provisions of Section 13 of the Unit Agreement.

<u>Proposed Additional Wells</u> - At this time it is proposed to drill no additional wells to the Siluro-Devonian or Pennsylvanian Formations during 1960. This proposal is based on the fact that the three present completions can adequately supply all gas required under the present gas sales contract. If it should develop that the present wells are incapable of supplying the contract or if an additional outlet for gas should develop, consideration will be given to amending the present plan to allow for additional development as required.

No additional Cherry Canyon wells are planned for 1960 in view of the unsuccessful attempt in Unit Well No. 5.

<u>Well Casing Program</u> - The well casing program will include such surface casing and other casing as may be required by the Director, the Commissioner and the Commission, or as set forth in approvals of the applicable U.S.G.S. and State of New Mexico forms. The producing string of casing may be set and cemented on top of, partially through or completely through the producing zone.

Offset Obligations - Appropriate and adequate measures will be taken to prevent drainage of unitized substances from lands subject to the Greenwood Pre-Grayburg Unit Agreement, or pursuant to applicable regulations, fair and reasonable compensatory royalty will be paid as provided in Section 17 of said Agreement.

<u>Further Development</u> - This plan of development shall constitute the drilling obligations of the Unit Operator under the terms of the Greenwood Pre-Grayburg Unit Agreement for the calendar year ending December 31, 1960. Before this plan expires, another plan for further development of the unit area will be submitted.

<u>Modifications</u> - It is understood that this plan of development is dependent upon certain information to be obtained prior to drilling and upon other contingencies such as availability of well casing; therefore, this plan of development may be modified to meet changing conditions or to protect the interest of all parties to this Agreement. Pan American Petroleum Corporation respectfully requests your approval of the subject initial participating area. Twelve copies of this instrument are attached. Three copies are provided for your files; the remaining nine are required by Pan American Petroleum Corporation for further distribution and should be returned to the undersigned.

This application is very similar to that which you approved on July 15, 1959, for the Initial Participating Area, Delaware Formation, Greenwood Pre-Grayburg Unit, Lea and Eddy Counties, New Mexico. Subsequent approval of that application was also obtained from the State Land Commissioner; however, the United States Geological Survey declined to approve it in its then existing form. You will note that the revised application is for the Cherry Canyon Formation rather than the Delaware Formation and sets up an initial participating area of 80 acres. The United States Geological Survey has stated that since Gulf's well is completed in the same formation as the Pan American Petroleum Corporation operated Greenwood Unit No. 4, and is a direct offset to the Pan American Petroleum Corporation operated well, it must be included in the participating area even though it does not participate in the Unit. The inclusion of this additional 40 acres in no way changes the participation from that previously set up by our original application which was captioned " Delaware Formation". As a matter of information, the United States Geological Survey has stated that they recognize only the Cherry Canyon Formation as being present in the Delaware in the Greenwood Pre-Grayburg Unit.

We will appreciate your early consideration of this matter and will be glad to provide any additional information that you may require.

The Gulf operated Littlefield "AB" No. 1 located in the SW/4 SW/4 of Section 22, T-18-S, R-31-E, Eddy County, New Mexico was completed on December 2, 1958 in the Cherry Canyon Formation, and flowed 387 barrels per day after being completed at a plug back total depth of 5032¹. The Pan American operated Greenwood Unit No. 4 located 660¹ from north and west lines of Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E, Eddy County, New Mexico was completed January 30, 1959, and has been determined to be a well capable of producing oil in commercial quantities. Greenwood Unit No. 4 was completed with a flowing potential of 63 barrels of oil and no water in 24 hrs. through an 11/64" choke with a tubing pressure of 300 psi. The well was completed through perforations from 4992¹ to 5010¹ after being drilled to a total depth of 5250¹ and plugged back to 5216¹.

The east and west offsets to Gulf's Littlefield "AB" No. 1, the discovery well in the Area, namely Gulf's Littlefield "AB" No. 2 in the SE/4 SW/4 of Section 22 and Gulf's Keohane No. 1 in the SE/4 SE/4 of Section 21, T-18-S, R-31-E, both failed to find commercial production in the Cherry Canyon Formation. Unit Well No. 5 logated in the SE/4 NW/4 Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E has also been completed without finding commercial production in the Cherry Canyon Formation. In view of only two commercial wells being obtained from the five locations drilled to date, an initial participating area of 80 acres, or 40 acres surrounding each producing well is being recommended. 



GEOLOGICAL AND ENGINEERING REPORT DELAWARE FORMATION GREENWOOD PRE-GRAYBURG UNIT EDDY AND LEA COUNTIES, NEW MEXICO

The Pan American operated Greenwood Unit No. 4 located 660° from the north line and 660° from the west line of Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E, Eddy County, New Mexico, was completed January 30, 1959, as a well capable of producing oil in commercial quantities from the Delaware formation, thus necessitating formation of an initial participating area for the Delaware formation. Greenwood Unit No. 4 was completed with a flowing potential of 63 barrels of oil and no water in 24 hours through an 11/64" choke with tubing pressure of 300 psi through Delaware perforations from 4992' to 5010° after being drilled to a total depth of 5250° and being plugged back to 5216°.

On the basis of the completion and the geological information available to date, the initial participating area proposed is 40 acres in size and is as shown on Exhibit "A" attached. This participating area consists of one 40 acre tract which includes all the drilling tract assigned to the Greenwood Unit No. 4.

The extent of productive limits of the Delaware formation has not been defined to the south, west or east of the Greenwood Unit No. 4. Gulf's Littlefield "AB" No. 1 located as the north offset was the discovery well in the Delaware formation in the area. The northwest and northeast diagonal offsets; the Gulf Littlefield "AB" No. 2 in the SE/4 of the SW/4 of Section 22, T-18-S, R-31-E and the Gulf Keohane No. 1 in the SE/4 of the SE/4 of Section 21, T-18-S, R-31-E have defined the productive limits in those directions, both failing to find commercial Delaware production. 



GEOLOGICAL AND ENGINEERING REPORT TO SUPPORT FIRST ENLARGED SILURO-DEVONIAN PARTICIPATING AREA, GREENWOOD PRE-GRAYBURG UNIT, LEA AND EDDY COUNTIES, NEW MEXICO

Completion of the Pan American operated Greenwood Unit No. 3 located 1985' FNL and 660' FEL of Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E, Eddy County, New Mexico as a well capable of producing gas condensate in commercial quantities in the Silurian-Devonian Formation necessitates the enlargement of the subject participating area. Greenwood Unit No. 3 was completed in July 1958 with an indicated deliverability of 1200 MCF of gas and 79 barrels of condensate against a back pressure of 690 psi. Subsequent remedial work and additional testing indicates the well is capable of a deliverability of about 1500 MCF of gas with 79 barrels of condensate per day.

The extent of productive limits of the Siluro-Devonian Formation is fairly well defined to the south, west, and north by virtue of two dry holes being Gulf's Littlefield "AB" No. 1 in the SW/4 SW/4 of Section 22, T-18-S, R-31-E, and the Greenwood No. 2 in the SW/4 NE/4 of Section 34, T-18-S, R-31-E. It is indicated from these completions and the attached cross section that a gas-water contact occurs at approximately -9000'. The 320 acre tract being the NW/4 Section 26, T-18-S, R-31-E and the NE/4 Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E is, therefore, indicated to lie within the productive limits of the Siluro-Devonian Zone.

Based on the above, it can be seen that an enlarged participating area consisting of 960 acres and comprising Wells No. 1 and 3 is reasonable.

The plan called for drilling a Siluro-Devonian test in the SE/4 NW/4 Section 26, T-18-S, R-31-E, Eddy County, New Mexico.

At the time the plan was submitted, Unit Well No. 1 located in the SE/4 SE/4 Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E, was producing from the Siluro-Devonian and the initial participating area had been approved. Unit Well No. 2, a projected Siluro-Devonian test located in the SW/4 NE/4 Section 34, T-18-S, R-31-E, was drilling in the Siluro-Devonian and plans were being made for testing. 

GEOLOGICAL AND ENGINEERING REPORT PENNSYLVANIAN FORMATION GREENWOOD PRE-GRAYBURG UNIT EDDY AND LEA COUNTIES, NEW MEXICO


Pan American operated Greenwood Unit No. 2 located 1980' from the North and East lines of Section 34, T-18-S, R-31-E, Eddy County, New Mexico was completed January 27, 1958, as a well capable of producing gas in commercial quantities from the Pennsylvanian formation, thus necessitating formation of an Initial Participating Area for the Pennsylvanian Formation. This well was completed with a calculated open flow of 7600 MCFPD through Pennsylvanian perforations from 10,912' to 10,948' and 11,425' to 11,438', after being drilled to a total depth of 12,925' and being plugged back to 11,495'. During potential test the maximum stabilized flow was at the rate of 6640 MCF and 279 barrels of condensate per day through a 44/64" choke with a flowing casing pressure of 1226 psi.

Prior to the drilling of Well No. 2, Greenwood Unit No. 1, a Siluro-Devomian gas well had been drill stem tested in the Pennsylvanian. On this test it produced at the rate of 12,000 MCF Plus 360 barrels of condensate per day from an interval correlative to the main producing interval in Well No. 2. On the basis of the extended pay continuity demonstrated by correlation of these two wells and other available geological information, an Initial Participating Area of 1440 acres is proposed, as shown on the attached Exhibit "A". This area consists of all of Section 34, the S/2 Section 27, the SW/4 Section 26, and the W/2 Section 35, T-18-S, R-31-E. Attached is a cross section showing by means of the Contact Log over the Pennsylvanian for each well, the location and correlation of the productive Pennsylvanian. The Contact Log shows the main or upper pay zone to increase in thickness of net porosity from 20' in Well No. 1 to 28' in Well No. 2, whereas, the lower zone is approximately 8' thick in both wells. A core recovered from well No. 2 over the main interval had a weighted average porosity of 9.3 per cent and a permeability of 3.1 millidarcies, for the 22' of cored section considered as net pay. The top few feet of net pay as indicated by logs were not cored. Radioactive and conventional Electric Logs obtained on these two wells further demonstrate the continuity and similarity of the two pays between wells.

The seismic map submitted with the application for the Greenwood Unit is still considered representative of the structure in this locality and closely reflects the structure of the Pennsylvanian. Initial testing conducted on both wells and the sustained production from Well No. 2 have not indicated the existence of a free water table in the Pennsylvanian, therefore, it is anticipated that the ultimate extent of the reservoir will be primarily a function of permeability and porosity development without significant relationship to structure. On the basis of pay continuity between the two wells, which have penetrated the Pennsylvanian on the Greenwood structure, it appears that an area significantly larger than the proposed Participating Area will be found capable of commercial production. From information now available it can be concluded that the

entire 1440 acres within the Proposed Initial Pennsylvanian Participating Area has been reasonably proven to be capable of gas production in commercial quantities.







The producing string of casing may be set and cemented on top of or partially through or completely through the producing zone.

Offset Obligations. Appropriate and adequate measures will be taken to prevent drainage of unitized substances from lands subject to the Greenwood Pre-Grayburg Unit Agreement, or pursuant to applicable regulations, fair and reasonable compensatory royalty will be paid as provided in Section 17 of said Agreement.

Further Development. This plan of development shall constitute the drilling obligations of the Unit Operator under the terms of the Greenwood Pre-Grayburg Unit Agreement for the period ending December 31, 1957. Before this plan expires, another plan for further development of the unit area will be submitted.

<u>Modifications.</u> It is understood that this plan of development is dependent upon certain information to be obtained prior to drilling and upon other contingencies such as availability of well casing; therefore, this plan of development may be modified to meet changing conditions or to protect the interest of all parties to this Agreement.

Effective Date. This plan of development shall be effective immediately upon approval of the Supervisor, Commission and Commissioner.



Pursuant to Section 11 of the Greenwood Pre-Grayburg Unit Agreement, approved April 23, 1956, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, as Unit Operator, determined, subject to the approval of the Director, Commissioner and Commission, that the Greenwood Unit No. 1 Well, completed in the Siluro-Devonian Zone, is capable of producing unitized substances in paying quantities and that an Initial Participating Area for the Siluro-Devonian Zone should accordingly be established. The proposed Initial Participating Area contains 1 μ acres and is composed of nine quarter sections around the discovery well including the quarter section on which the well is located. The proposed participating area is described as follows: Township 18 South, Range 31 East: Section 26: W/2; Section 27: All; Section 34: N/2; Section 35: NW/4 containing 1440 acres more or less.

The Greenwood Unit No. 1 Well is located 660' from the South line and 660' from the East Line of Section 27, Township 18 South, Range 31 East, Eddy County, New Mexico, and was completed February 10, 1957 at a plugged back total depth of 12,784' having been plugged back from a total depth of 13,446'. The Siluro-Devonian Zone between 12,655' - 12,700' and 12,741' -12,766' was perforated and treated with 2500 gallons of acid in the upper zone and 1000 gallons of acid in the lower zone. On potential test the well produced at a rate of 8,372 MCF of gas with a gas condensate ratio of 15,610 cu. ft. per barrel and with a flowing tubing pressure of 1094 psig. This test and subsequent testing conducted on April 2, 1957 indicates that the well has a calculated open flow potential of about 20,000 MCF per day. This well is not currently producing. Completion of the Pan American operated Greenwood Unit No. 1, located 660' from the south line and 660' from the east lines of Section 27, T-18-S, R-31-E, Eddy County, New Mexico, as a well capable of producing gas condensate in commercial quantities from the Siluro-Devonian formation, necessitates the formation of an initial participating area. Greenwood Unit No. 1 was completed February 10, 1957, at a plugback depth of 12,784' through casing perforations 12,655' to 12,766'. Initial potential of the well was 8372 MCF of gas and 536 barrels of 58.1 degree API gravity condensate with a flowing tubing pressure of 1094 psig. This test and subsequent testing of the well conducted on April 2, 1957, indicates that the well has a calculated absolute open flow potential of about 20,000 MCF per day.

On the basis of completion, as well as local and regional geologic information, the initial participating area proposed is 1440 acres in size and is as shown on Exhibit "A" attached. This initial participating area consists of the nine 160-acre tracts which include all direct and diagonal offsetting drilling tracts immediately surrounding the Greenwood Unit No. 1. Under New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission rules and regulations, a drilling tract in a gas pool consists of 160 surface acres.

Exhibit "C" is a portion of the microlog survey of the Siluro-Devonian section on Greenwood Unit No. 1 which shows that there is approximately 420' of gross pay section present above the indicated water table. Other logs, as well as core information, indicate that the entire Siluro-Devonian section penetrated has about the same order of porosity development, although permeability development is somewhat erratic. In the Greenwood Unit No. 1, the interval 12,846' to 13,036' was diamond cored. The average porosity of this interval from core analysis was 4.0%. The completion of the well was in an interval which was not cored. Correlation of core data with logs showed, however, that the completion interval has about the same order of porosity as the cored interval. Further correlation showed also that the entire Siluro-Devonian formation penetrated contained some porosity although of a uniformly low order. On this basis, it is concluded that the entire 420' of Siluro-Devonian formation above a depth of about 12,800' in this well is productive of gas condensate.

Regionally, as shown by Exhibit "B", the Greenwood Unit is located on a major structural trend established by the Greenwood Unit No. 1, the Shell Perry No. 1, and the Texas Company Richards No. 1. Although Exhibit "B" is a dip map on top of the Mississippian it is believed to also reflect the structural configuration of the Siluro-Devonian and deeper formations. On the basis of data shown on Exhibit "B", this trend could be at least 15 miles long. East-west reversal of dip is shown both by the Shell and the Texas Company wells. North critical dip at Greenwood Unit No. 1 is approximately 600' in a distance of about 8 miles.

Locally, as shown by the seismic map submitted with the application for formation of the Greenwood Unit, the Greenwood structure includes approximately 12 sections with an effective closure of about 400'. Since the Greenwood Unit No. 1 was drilled near the top of this indicated structure and included about 400' of productive section, this tends to confirm the seismic interpretation and indicates that a large portion of the Greenwood Unit is proven productive in the Siluro-Devonian formation.

Completion data on Greenwood Unit No. 1, sub-surface control afforded by this well and others in this general area showing the regional geologic picture, and seismic data on the local structure all indicate that most of the Greenwood Unit is probably productive in the Siluro-Devonian. Therefore, an initial participating area consisting of nine 160-acre tracts immediately surrounding the discovery well is reasonable.
