Four of the first five wells will be of an exploratory nature designed to block out reserves west of Carson Unit 1 (see enclosed map) and the drilling sequence is planned as follows: Carson Unit 34-13, 14-13, 32-14, 41-23, and 41-14. This sequence provides for outstepping progressively westward from proven production at Carson Unit 1 in order to minimize the risk of drilling a non-commercial well. The remaining three proposed wells, Unit 34-17, 12-20, and 21-19 are at relatively proven locations. We plan to drill these wells in the event that any of the westerly outsteps require extensive testing or evaluation before proceeding farther westward, thus assuring a continuous operation.

Four of the locations, Unit 34-13, 34-17, 12-20, and 21-19, are within the Proposed Initial Participating Area of the Unit. We will obtain the approval of Phillips and Skelly before drilling these wells.

The current restricted market outlet for crude oil has limited production from wells in the Four Corners area. Preliminary work has been started on building the Four Corners Pipeline Company's crude line to California and completion is planned for early 1958. When completed, this line should provide a capacity market outlet and a maximum possible wellhead price. Until that time, we plan to produce only certain key wells for evaluation purposes on the Carson Unit; the remaining wells will be shut-in.

Your approval of this Plan of Development is respectfully requested.

Pursuant to the Unit Agreement for the Carson Unit Area, San Juan County, New Mexico, we submit for your consideration the following preliminary plan of development to cover the drilling of five wells on the Carson Unit subsequent to the approval of the Carson Unit Agreement on November 15, 1956. After completing and testing these five wells, a supplementary plan of development will be filed.

Prior to November 15, 1956, four wells, Carson Unit 1, 2, 3, and 4, had been drilled on the Carson Unit in accordance with Section 9 of the Unit Agreement. All four wells were completed in the Gallup (Upper Cretaceous) sandstone; however, Carson Unit 1 tested the Dakota (Cretaceous) sandstone and found it water bearing, before being plugged back to be completed in the Gallup. Initial rates have been established for Unit 1 and Unit 4, flowing 802 B/D oil and 643 B/D oil, respectively; only a very small amount of oil has been produced because of the limited market outlet for the crude. Initial rates have not yet been established for Unit 2 and Unit 3 as not all of the fracturing oil has been recovered from these wells.

The results of drilling in the Carson Unit-Bisti Field have indicated a productive band of good pay development trending northwest-southeast through the area as shown on the attached map. Electric log analysis indicates that Unit 1 and Unit 1 have fairly good pay development and thus are within this productive band while Unit 2 and Unit 3 have much poorer pay development and may be near the edge or outside the commercially productive limits.

Our preliminary plan covers the drilling of <u>five Gallup sandstone</u> wells on the Carson Unit at the following approximate locations:

Carson Unit 33-24, C NW/4 SE/4 Section, 24, T. 25 N., R. 12 W., NMPM.

Carson Unit 43-13, C NE/4 SE/4 Section, 13, T. 25 N., R. 12 W., NMPM.

Carson Unit 41-13, C NE/4 NE/4 Section, 13, T. 25 N., R. 12 W., NMPM.

Carson Unit 23-17, C NE/4 SW/4, Section 17, T. 25 N., R. 11 W., NMPM.

Carson Unit 23-20, C NE/4 SW/4, Section 20, T. 25 N., R. 11 W., NMPM.

Three of these wells, Carson Unit 33-24, 43-13, and 41-13, have been drilled to total depth but have not yet been production tested. It is planned that Carson Unit 23-17 and Carson Unit 23-20 will be drilled as a two-well continuous program and that Carson Unit 23-17 will be spudded about February 24, 1957.

The locations for these five wells were selected so as to establish lines of wells at right angles to the indicated productive band. Carson Unit 33-24, 43-13, and 41-13 infill between Carson Unit 1, 2, and 3 to provide one such line. Carson Unit 23-17 and 23-20 outstep to the north and south, respectively, from Carson Unit 4 to form a second line of wells across the trend. The data obtained from these five wells, together with that from the tests previously drilled, will help delineate the trend of the productive band and block out reserves on the Carson Unit.

Production from wells in the Four Corners area is limited at the present time by lack of a market outlet for the crude. The solution to the outlet problem is the building of a pipeline from the area to an adequate market outlet, which, we understand, is now in the planning stage. In general, we plan to produce only certain key wells for evaluation purposes on the Carson Unit; the remaining wells we plan to shut-in until the pipeline outlet is available.

Your approval of this preliminary Plan of Development is respectfully requested.

This proposed initial participating area is predicated upon the knowledge and information first obtained upon the completion of unit wells Nos. 1 and 4 on September 29, 1956, and November 15, 1956, respectively. Carson Unit 1 is located in the NEINEI of Section 24, T. 25 N., R. 12 W., N.M.P.M., and was completed in the Gallup (Upper Cretaceous) interval 4875-4895' with an initial production rate of 802 B/D oil. Carson Unit 4 is located in the NEINWI of Section 20, T. 25 N., R. 11 W., N.M.P.M. and was completed in the Gallup (Upper Cretaceous) intervals 4869-4888', 4900-4913', 4945-4949', 4961-4963', and 4979-4984' with an initial production rate of 643 B/D oil. We consider Unit No. 1 and Unit No. 4 wells to be paying wells under the Unit Agreement.

Wherefore, applicant respectfully requests that the said Director approve the hereinabove selection of lands to constitute the initial participating area to be effective November 15, 1956.
