Gentlemen:

I have this date approved your amendment of section 3 of the Little Lucky Lake unit agreement, New Modec, to be effective as of the date the West Henshaw Premier waterile od unit becomes effective. Said amendment permits the elimination of all formations above the base of the Grayburg formation from the effects of the Little Lucky Lake unit agreement so that the Premier sand reservoir can be operated under the proposed West Henshaw Premier unit.

Our letter of July 23 granting preliminary approval to the amendment of section 3 also gave preliminary approval to a proposed amendment of section 2 (e). The amendment of section 2 (e) was to postpone automatic elimination of acreage until you had an opportunity to attempt further exploration within the unit area. Inasmuch as the automatic elimination date has now passed we regard the proposed amendment of section 2 (e) as not having been timely completed and expect to receive, pursuant to section 2 (e), a description of the lands eliminated from the unit.


You have filed a composite ratification and joinder to the unit agreement and unit operating agreement by the lessees and working interest owners of tract 5, lease New Mexico 01924. We no longer consider said tract a part of the unit area. However, if you consider said tract as a part of the unit area we object to the joinder on the basis that the tract, separated as it is from the rest of the unit, could not be successfully operated as a part of the unit area and hence would not further the purposes of the unit agreement.

After the amendment of section 3 becomes effective and the wells which now constitute the Premier sand participating area are transferred to the West Henshaw Premier unit, we will be faced with the problem of having those formations below the Grayburg still committed to, but not participating in, the Little Lucky Lake unit. To avoid this situation we ask that the Little Lucky Lake unit be contracted to eliminate all lands not within the Devonian participating area effective as of the effective date of the amendment of section 3.







The operators in the West Wenshaw Grayburg Pool have begun negotiations for the formation of a secondary recovery unit for the purpose of waterflooding the Premier Sand reservoir.

A part of the acreage to be included in the project area is now in the Little Lucky Lake Unit, and it would facilitate the inclusion of this acreage in the secondary recovery project if the Fremier Sand were removed from the Little Lucky Lake Unit. This can be readily and satisfactorily accomplished by amending the definition of unitized substances in the Little Lucky Lake Unit Agreement to cover the oil and gas in only those formations lying below the base of the Grayburg formation.

All operators owning working interests committed to the Little Lucky Lake Unit Agreement have tentatively agreed to its amendment in this manner, and we are submitting herewith for your consideration and preliminary approval a copy of the text of a proposed amendment, with signature spaces and certificates of acknowledgement to be added later.

AMENDMENT OF UNIT AGREEMENT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATION OF THE LITTLE LUCKY LAKE UNIT AREA CHAVES AND EDDY COUNTIES, NEW MEXICO

UNITED STATES GEOLOGICAL SURVEY NO. 14-08-001-4707

Subject to approval by the Director of the United States Geological Survey and the Commissioner of Public Lands of the State of New Mexico, the undersigned, being the owners of all working interests committed to the Unit Agreement for the Development and Operation of the Little Lucky Lake Unit Area embracing lands situated in Chaves and Eddy Counties, New Mexico, which agreement is dated January 8, 1958, was approved by said Director April 16, 1958, and bears United States Geological Survey No. 14-08-001-4707, do hereby amend Section 3 of said Unit Agreement to read as follows, to-wit:

"3. UNITIZED LAND AND UNITIZED SUBSTANCES: All land committed to this agreement shall constitute land referred to herein as "unitized land" or "land subject to this agreement." All oil and gas in any and all formations of the unitized land lying below the base of the Grayburg formation are unitized under the terms of this agreement and herein are called "unitized substances." The "base of the Grayburg formation" is defined for the purposes hereof as the contact between the Grayburg and San Andres formations which occurs at a depth of 2860 feet beneath the derrick floor, or 1041 feet above sea level, in the Little Lucky Lake Unit Shell Well No. 1, located in Lot 9 of Section 3, Township 16-S, Range 30-E, N.M.P.M., as recorded on the sonic log and Laterolog of said well, dated May 28, 1959".

This agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, with the same force and effect as if all parties had joined in the execution of a single instrument, and shall become effective on the date that the Unit Agreement for the West Henshaw Premier Unit becomes effective provided all parties hereto execute this agreement and it has been approved by said Director and Commissioner.

Referring to your letter dated September 13, 1961, you have stated that the last Plan of Development approved by the Commissioner and Supervisor was for Devonian Development covering November 16, 1959 to November 16, 1960. We also approved an extension of time as requested by your letter dated October 27, 1960.

This extension of time was to be until the TSI Spencer Federal "B" No. 1 was completed. You show this well completed as January 10, 1961, therefore, you have had no Plan of Development or entension since January 1961.

It would seem that it is time for Texaco Inc. as the Unit Operator to comply with section 10 of the Unit Agreement. Gentlemen:

The Little Lucky Lake Unit Agreement was approved by the Director of the U.S. Geological Survey on April 15, 1958, and the Commissioner of Public Lands of the State of New Mexico on Narch 12, 1958. The Unit Agreement is dated January 8, 1958, and was effective on April 16, 1958.

Enclosed find copies of a proposed Amendment to the Unitagreement to revise Sections 2(e) and 3. Preliminary concurred by the Director to this Amendment is requested after which appriate signatures and acknowledgments will be obtained. The anal executed Amendment will, of course, be subject to formal approvably the State of New Mexico officials, and by the Director.

Section 2(e) provides for automatic elimination of all legal subdivisions of land which are not entitled to be in a participating area within five years after the first day of the month following the effective date of the first initial participating area, subject to certain conditions and exceptions. The first initial participating area for the Little Lucky Lake Unit was approved effective August 4, 1958, and the automatic elimination date is therefore September 1, 1963.

Section 3 provides that all oil and gas in any and all formations of the unitized area are unitized under the terms of the Unit Agreement.

Texaco Inc., as Unit Operator for the Little Lucky Lake Unit Agreement, respectfully makes application for preliminary concurrence by the Director of an Amendment to the Unit Agreement

which would extend the automatic elimination date under Section 2(e) for an additional period of three years, or to September 1, 1966, and limit unitized lands under Section 3 to those formations lying below the base of the Grayburg formation, for the reasons which follow:

1. Unit Development Inconclusive

Since the effective date of the Unit Agreement, nineteen (19) wells have been drilled in the unit area as follows:

Unitized substances in paying quantities have been discovered in three formations, the Premier Sand-Grayburg, the Devonian and the Ellenburger. The Atoka (Pennsylvanian) formation has also indicated a capacity for paying production, as evidenced by the production from the #1 State LLA, which produced a total of 938 barrels from the period October 9, 1959 to August 1, 1960.

With four or more pay zones involved, substantial exploratory effort and expense, and considerable time, will be necessary for effective evaulation.

2. Time Required for Negotiation Between Working Interest Owners

A recent exploratory well, the Texaco No. 1 Cone-Federal, developed a show of oil and gas in the Pennsylvanian formation in drill-stem tests from 8,531' to 8,536' and in the Ellenburger formation from 11,900' to 11,967'. This well was drilled under acreage arrangements

made with another working interest owner, and involved negotiations over a period of approximately five (5) months. It also illustrates the good faith efforts being made to explore for and develop additional unitized substances.

It is submitted that much time is often necessary to complete negotiations between the working interest owners for commencement of these types of deep and expensive exploratory wells.

3. Approved Participating Areas will not Provide Significant Additional Development

Two participating areas have been approved by the Director and the Commissioner as follows:

Premier Sand-Grayburg Zone:

Initial Area: Effective August 4, 1962, covering

Lots 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15, Sec-

tion 3, 16S-30E.

First Enlargement: Effective January 1, 1959, covering

Lots 9 and 16, Section 3, 16S-30E.

Second Enlargement: Effective May 1, 1959, covering Lot

13, Section 3, 16S-30E.

Third Enlargement: Effective June 1, 1959, covering Lot

12, Section 3, 16S-30E.

Devonian Zone:

Initial Area: Effective October 12, 1962, covering

NE/4 Section 29, 15S-30E.

First Enlargement: Effective June 1, 1959, covering SE/4

Section 29, 15S-30E.

Second Enlargement: Effective September 1, 1959, covering

W/2 Section 29, 15S-30E.

Third Enlargement: Effective August 1, 1960, covering

all Section 20, 15S-30E.

There is no plan of development for additional drilling in these two participating areas. In the opinion of the Unit Operator, increased production and reserves of unitized substances must come from further exploration, rather than from the present participating areas. This will require considerable additional time, effort and expense.

4. Pendency of Secondary Recovery Operations Delays Evaluation

Shell Oil Company, one of the working interest owners, has proposed a secondary recovery unit for conservation and pressure stabilization in a major part of the West Henshaw-Grayburg Mield. This will be known as the West Henshaw-Grayburg Unit and will cover a substantial portion of the Little Lucky Lake Unit Area. The plan of unitization for the West Henshaw-Grayburg Unit has not yet been approved by all of the lease owners within the proposed unit area, but various reservoir committees have been meeting periodically to discuss the most efficient means of secondary recovery, participation factors, and other matters. Much more discussion and agreement, involving considerable time, will be necessary.

It is our understanding that complex problems of administration of the two overlapping units by the Regional Oil and Gas Supervisor and the Commissioner will be created with the approval of the West Henshaw-Grayburg Unit. To date the solution to these administrative problems has not been resolved. The enclosed form of Amendment would exclude from the Little Lucky Lake Unit all zones above the base of the Grayburg formation. Approval of this proposed agreement by the Supervisor and the Commissioner is necessary before the West Henshaw-Grayburg Unit working interest owners will be able to construct any workable form of secondary recovery agreements.

A complete plan of unitization for the Grayburg will not be possible until the governmental agencies, working interest owners and overriding royalty interest owners both approve and execute the agreement for exclusion of the Grayburg formation from the Little Lucky Lake Unit and approve and execute the West Henshaw-Grayburg Unit. Further evaluation of the Grayburg zone in the Little Lucky Lake Unit Area has been curtailed and delayed due to these pending revisions in existing ownership and control.

Technical personnel of the applicable working interest owners have been spending much time studying the secondary recovery prospects in the Grayburg formation, at considerable sacrifice to further exploration in the Little Lucky Lake Unit Area. The automatic elimination date is imminent and these secondary recovery complications should be considered.

5. Disposition of Gas Can Provide More Evaluation

As indicated above, the Texaco No. 1 Peery-Federal, the discovery well in the Devonian for the Little Lucky Lake Unit, also successfully tested the Ellenburger formation, flowing 27 barrels of distillate and 1,096,000 cubic feet of gas per day from perforations between 12,068' and 12,106'. The Texaco No. 2 Peery-Federal also tested gas in the Ellenburger formation. An application for a participating area for the Ellenburger formation is being considered by the Unit Operator.

For a considerable length of time the Unit Operator has been attempting to secure a market for the gas capable of being produced from the Little Lucky Lake Unit, including the Ellenburger gas, after having considered the alternative of constructing a gasoline plant in the unit area. It is believed that gas purchasing arrangements will be made at some time in the future.

The best possible gas purchase contract is being sought, for the best interests of the working interest owners, the overriding royalty interest owners, and the best interests of the United States and the State of New Mexico. It is prudent that sufficient time be allowed to negotiate favorable terms in such a sale.

Production and marketing of gas from the Little Lucky Lake Unit Agreement will provide valuable additional information. Further development and exploration under the Unit Agreement can thereby be made possible if the automatic elimination date is extended as requested. An application for an initial Ellenburger participating area can best be made when market arrangements are consummated.

6. Summary

All considerations mentioned above justify the requested extension of the automatic elimination provisions of the Little Lucky Lake Unit Agreement. While a five-year elimination date seemed logical and reasonable when the Unit Agreement was approved, the working interest owners believe that the above mentioned complications, most of which could not have been foreseen at the time of approval, constitute warranted exceptions. Limiting the Unit Agreement to all formations below the Grayburg zone is necessary to conclude a secondary recovery unit in the West Henshaw-Grayburg Field.

Now, therefore, Texaco Inc., Operator of the Little Lucky Lake Unit Agreement, on behalf of all parties at interest, hereby respectfully requests preliminary concurrence by the Director to the amendment of Sections 2(e) and 3 as discussed herein.

AMENDMENT OF UNIT AGREEMENT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATION OF THE LITTLE LUCKY LAKE UNIT AREA CHAVES AND EDDY COUNTIES, NEW MEXICO

UNITED STATES GEOLOGICAL SURVEY NO. 14-08-001-4707

Subject to approval by the Director of the United States Geological Survey and the Commissioner of Public Lands of the State of New Mexico, the undersigned, being the owners of all working interests committed to the Unit Agreement for the Development and Operation of the Little Lucky Lake Unit Area embracing lands situated in Chaves and Eddy Counties, New Mexico, which agreement is dated January 8, 1958, was approved by said Director April 16, 1958, and bears United States Geological Survey No. 14-08-001-4707, do hereby amend said Unit Agreement as follows, to-wit:

- 1. Sub-section 2(e) is deleted and the following is made a part of said Unit Agreement as the new sub-section 2(e):
 - "2(e). All legal subdivisions of unitized lands (i.e. 40 acres by Government survey or its nearest lot or tract equivalent in instances of irregular surveys, however, unusually large lots or tracts shall be considered in multiples of 40 acres, or the nearest aliquot equivalent thereof, for the purpose of elimination under this sub-section), no parts of which are entitled to be in a participating area within eight (8) years after the first day of the month following the effective date of the first initial participating area established under this unit agreement, shall be eliminated automatically from this agreement, effective as of the first day thereafter, and such lands shall no longer be a part of the unit area and shall no longer be subject to this agreement, unless at the expiration of said eight year period diligent drilling operations are in progress on unitized lands not entitled to participation, in which event all such lands shall remain

subject hereto for so long as such drilling operations are continued diligently, with not more than ninety (90) days time elapsing between the completion of one such well and the commencement of the next such well, except that the time allowed between such wells shall not expire earlier than thirty (30) days after the expiration of any period of time during which drilling operations are prevented by a matter beyond the reasonable control of Unit Operator as set forth in the section hereof entitled "Unavoidable Delay"; provided that all legal subdivisions of lands not in a participating area and not entitled to become participating under the applicable provisions of this agreement within ten (10) years after said first day of the month following the effective date of said first initial participating area shall be eliminated as above specified. Determination of creditable "Unavoidable Delay" time shall be made by Unit Operator and subject to approval of the Commissioner and the Director. The Unit Operator shall, within ninety (90) days after the effective date of any elimination hereunder, describe the area so eliminated to the satisfaction of the Commissioner and the Director and promptly notify all parties in interest.

If conditions warrant extension of the ten (10) year period specified in this subsection 2(e), a single extension of not to exceed two (2) years may be accomplished by consent of the owners of 90% of the current unitized working interests and 50% of the current unitized basic royalty interests (exclusive of the basic royalty interests of the United States), on a total-nonparticipating-acreage basis, respectively, with approval of the Commissioner and the Director, provided such extension application is submitted to the

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Commissioner and the Director not later than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of said ten (10) year period.

Any expansion of the unit area pursuant to this section which embraces lands theretofore eliminated pursuant to this sub-section 2(e) shall not be considered automatic commitment or recommitment of such lands."

- 2. Section 3 is deleted and the following is made a part of said Unit Agreement as the new Section 3:
 - "3. UNITIZED LAND AND UNITIZED SUBSTANCES: All land committed to this agreement shall constitute land referred to herein as "unitized land" or "land subject to this agreement." All oil and gas in any and all formations of the unitized land lying below the base of the Grayburg formation are unitized under the terms of this agreement and herein are called "unitized substances." The "base of the Grayburg formation" is defined for the purposes hereof as the contact between the Grayburg and San Andres formations which occurs at a depth of 2860 feet beneath the derrick floor, or 1041 feet above sea level, in the Little Lucky Lake Unit Shell Well No. 1, located in Lot 9 of Section 3, Township 16-S, Range 30-E, N.M.P.M., as recorded on the sonic log and Laterolog of said well, dated May 28, 1959".

This agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, with the same force and effect as if all parties had joined in the execution of a single instrument, and shall become effective at 7:00 a.m. on the first day of the calendar month next following its execution by all parties hereto and its approval by said Director and Commissioner.
