CERTIFICATE OF APPROVAL

BY COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC LANDS, STATE OF NEW MEXICO

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There having been presented to the undersigned Commissioner of Public Lands of the State of New Mexico for examination, the attached Agreement for the development and operation of acreage which is described within the attached Agreement, dated which has been executed or is to be executed by parties owning and holding oil and gas leases and royalty interests in and under the property described, and upon examination of said Agreement, the Commissioner finds:

- (a) That such agreement will tend to promote the conservation of oil and gas and the better utilization of reservoir energy in said area.
- (b) That under the proposed agreement the State of New Mexico will receive its fair share of the recoverable oil or gas in place under its lands in the area.
- (c) That each beneficiary Institution of the State of New Mexico will receive its fair and equitable share of the recoverable oil and gas under its lands within the area.
- (d) That such agreement is in other respects for the best interests of the state, with respect to state lands.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority conferred upon me under Sections 7-11-39, 7-11-40, 7-11-41, 7-11-47, 7-11-48, New Mexico Statutes Annotated 1953 Compilation, I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Public Lands of the State of New Mexico, for the purpose of more properly conserving the oil and gas resources of the State, do hereby consent to and approve the said Agreement, and any leases embracing lands of the State of New Mexico within the area shall be and the same are hereby amended to conform with the terms thereof, and shall remain in full force and effect according to the terms and conditions of said Agreement. This approval is subject to all of the provisions of the aforesaid statutes.

Gentlemen:

The Cone Jalmat Yates Pool Unit was authorized for water flood operation through Commission Order No. R-2494 dated June 11, 1963. An expansion of the water flood program was authorized through the Commission's Administrative Orders No. WFX-180 and WFX-206 dated August 27, 1964 and May 3, 1965 respectively.

Water flood operations within that portion of the Unit, as authorized by the above set out orders, has resulted in the increase of crude oil production from an average 4,000 barrels per month prior to water flood to a current 21,000 barrels per month. That developed portion of the Unit now under such operation has contributed some 400,000 barrels of oil, over and above that which may have been recovered by primary depletion, and its producing character is improving.

The Unit and Unit Operating Agreements governing the conduct of this Unit provide for expansion of the Unit to include productive acreage contiguous to the Unit where deemed advisable.

The Working Interest Owners to the Unit have voted in accord with the Unit Operating Agreement, to expand the Unit to include as Tract No. 9 of the Unit that oil and gas lease occupying the SE/4 of Section 25, T22S, R35E, Lea County, New Mexico and known as New Mexico State Lease E-396-6 dated June 11, 1945.

Working Interest Owners in that proposed Tract No. 9, described above, have executed a Joinder Agreement providing for the inclusion of their leasehold into the Unit, through ratification of the Unit and Unit Operating Agreements.

Copies of the executed Joinder Agreement, pertaining to this Tract No. 9, have been transmitted to the Commissioner of Public Lands of the State of New Mexico for approval on the part of the State, as mineral owner under this tract and the Unit.

The Working Interest Owners of the Subject Unit are joined by Working Interest Owners in the proposed Tract No. 9 to the Unit, in requesting that the Commission grant administrative approval of the expansion of the Unit to include, as Tract No. 9 of the Unit, that oil and gas lease described as the SE/4 of Section 25, T22S, R35E, Lea County, New Mexico. This lease is now operated as the Tenneco-Amerada State "B" Lease in the Jalmat Yates-Seven Rivers Field.

The Working Interest Owners further request that the Commission grant administrative approval for the expansion of the Unit water injection program to provide water injection into Unit wells No. 7-1, 8-3, 9-2, 9-3, and 10-2. Attached hereto are Commission Forms C-103, relative to each of the wells for which approval of conversion to water injection is requested.

Water required to inject into the expanded Unit will be derived from existing Santa Rosa sources now being employed in the Unit, and through return of produced water to the Yates reservoir. All water will be handled through closed systems, with appropriate chemical treatment to prohibit precipitation of solids and corrosion of material. All produced water to be returned to the reservoir will be maintained in a separate and isolated system from that through which Santa Rosa water is delivered to the reservoir. It is estimated that a maximum of 400 barrels of water per day, per injection well, will be required and the maximum wellhead injection pressure will be limited to 1300 psig.

Expansion of the Unit as herein requested will increase the area of the Unit from 1600 acres to 1760 acres. It will also place under water flood influence a Yates Sand reservoir area, which has contributed some 360,000 barrels of oil through primary energy depletion. This area is expected to contribute some 600,000 barrels of additional oil through application of water flood as requested herein.

For your convenience, we enclose herewith a map of the Unit area representing its disposition after expansion as requested herein.

Duplicate copies of this application, along with attachments, have been transmitted to the State Engineer's Office, Santa Fe, New Mexico. Also, Copies of this application are transmitted to Cities Service Oil Company and Continental Oil Company, whose properties offset the Unit to the East.




