ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on July 19, 1966, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Slvis A. Utz.

NOW, on this 5th day of August, 1966, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
 - (2) That the applicant, Continental Oil Company, seeks approval of the Sumont-Hardy Unit Agreement covering 1930 acres, more or less, of State, Federal and Fee lands described as follows:

LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO

TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM
Section 25: 5/2 S/2
Section 36: 411

TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 38 EAST, NMPM Section 31: Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, and SE/4 SW/4

Cash Vo. 3428 Order No. 8-3101

TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 36 MAST, SMAM Section 1: Lote 1, 8, and 9

TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 37 MAST, HMSS Section 5: Abts 3, 4, 5, and 5 Section 6: Lots 1 through 12, Lots 16, 15, and 16, NE/4 SW/4 and N=/4 SE/4

(3) That approval of the proposed unit agreement should promote the prevention of waste and the protection of correlative rights within the unit area.

IN IS THEREFORS ORDERED:

- () That the Sumont-Hardy Unit Agreement is hereby approved.
- (1) That the plan contained in said unit agreement for the development and operation of the unit area is mereby approved in principle as a proper conservation measure; provided, nowever, that notwithstanding any of the provisions contained in said unit agreement, this approval shall not be considered as waiving or re-industring, in any manner, any right, duty, or obligation which is now, or may mereafter be, vested in the Commission to supervise and control operations for the exploration and development of any lands committed to the unit and production of cil or gas therefrom.
- (i) That the unit operator shall file with the Commission an executed proginal or executed counterpart of the unit agreement within 30 days after the effective date thereof; that in the event of subsequent joinder by any party or expansion or contraction of the unit area, the unit operator shall file with the Commission within 30 days thereafter counterparts of the unit agreement reflecting the subscription of those interests having joined or ratified.
- of said unit agreement by the Commissioner of Fubic Lands for the State of New Mexico and the Director of the United States Geological Survey; that this order shall terminate the last unit operator shall notify the Commission immediately in writing of such termination.

(5) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
