

We represent Cecilia Wirt Simms, the mineral owner under an oil and gas lease covering 1601.41 acres which has been committed to the above unit. 11.04 acres under the lease are within a Pictured Cliffs participating area and have been in the participating area since 1958. The remaining 1,590.37 acres under the lease are undeveloped and not within any participating area. We attach a plat which shows the participating areas, the tracts totaling 1,601.41 acres under the Simms' lease, and the acreage which was automatically eliminated from the unit in 1958.

Only one well has been drilled since 1961. El Paso Natural Gas Company, the unit operator, has submitted for approval a 1975 drilling program which contemplates the drilling of four Pictured Cliffs wells within the established Pictured Cliffs participating area. The proposed plan of development, in fact all plans of development since 1960, is not satisfactory from the standpoint of our client. It is obvious that neither the unit operator nor the Simms' lessee (Amoco Production Company) intends to carry out a program of development which would be beneficial to the Simms' mineral interest. Accordingly, we respectfully request that the plan of development not be approved or, in the alternative, you make demand on the unit operator (pursuant to Section 2 of the Unit Agreement) to prepare a notice of proposed contraction of the unit area which would effect the elimination of all of the Simms' lands from the unit other than the 11.04 acres presently in the participating area.



Your letter of July 16, 1975 concerning contraction of the captioned Unit was forwarded to the working interest owners with the request that they advise us of their recommendations as to the response which El Paso as Unit Operator should make to such letter. A considerable majority of such owners strongly opposed contraction. Copies of Amoco's and T.H. 



Please reference your letter of October 1, 1975, which requested our comments concerning the State of New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission's demand that the subject unit be contracted. We offer the following reply which you as unit operator should make to the Commission:

It is our understanding that the area which would be taken out of the unit does not include any state lands. It includes some private lands, but the majority of the lands are federal. Since the State's property rights are not affected, we believe any demand must be originated by the USGS.

Since there is still a real possibility that additional drilling outside the participating area may prove desirable if gas prices improve, and since if such drilling is conducted it can be more efficiently carried out under the unit agreement, we would oppose any demands, even if made by the USGS.

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

Gentlemen:

In reply to your letter of October 1, 1975, concerning the New Mexico State Oil Conservation Commission request that the San Juan 30-4 Unit be contracted, of course, we do not want to contract the unit area, and we do not understand what right the State has to ask us to do so.

The State of New Mexico's contention that the Unit Development over the last ten years has established the productive area is correct in so far as the controlled and restricted gas prices dictated the economic limits of the productive area. and suppressed the desire to drill exploratory wells. We are now entering a time when the effect of the controlled gas prices is becoming known to the public and government, and even though we do not as yet have a free market the prospects are brighter. Right now there is considerable confusion as to the future of gas prices and what effect they will have on the economic limit of the productive area of the 30-4 Unit, and to the number of exploratory wells that will be drilled.

Because of the controlled prices of the past, the uncertainty of the future prices, or the future course of governmental influence in the gas industry, we believe that it is premature to state that the productive area of the Unit has been established, and that there will not be any drilling outside the participating area. Certainly, if the price for natural gas in the San Juan Basin in anyway approximated the free market value for the energy it contains, there would be many wells contemplated, and I am sure some would be in the 30-4 Unit. On this basis we would object to contracting the size of the 30-4 Unit.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Paragraph 2(c) of the San Juan 30-4 Unit Agreement, El Paso Natural Gas Company, as Unit Operator, attaches letters evidencing notification of the proposed contraction of such Unit to the working interest owners and copies of responses which contained objections to such proposed contraction.

El Paso Natural Gas Company in its capacity as a working interest owner in the San Juan 30-4 Unit wishes to add the following observations concerning the proposed contraction:

- Parties holding 99.31% of the working interest in gas have expressed objections to the proposed contraction; parties holding the remaining .69% had no objections or failed to respond.
- 2. El Paso recognizes the role of the Commission as guardian of the rights of fee owners in the administration of units. In this regard, we observe that much of the acreage proposed by the Commission to be contracted out of the Unit is federal acreage. We respectfully submit that a demand for contraction insofar as it removes federal lands from unit boundaries should ideally originate from the United States Geological Survey or should at least bear the endorsement of that agency.

In view of the demands made by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission in its letter of December 3, 1975 and the language contained in Paragraph 2 of the Unit Agreement, El Paso, as Unit Operator, feels we have no alternative except to request contraction of the Unit as demanded.

We have been advised by both the United States Geological Survey and the Bureau of Land Management that the proposed contraction, if approved, will not result in the segregation of Federal leases as to lands within and without the Unit. Thus, the Federal acreage outside the Unit will be perpetuated by production from within the Unit. The effect of the contraction on fee acreage is conjectural. Of course, lands eliminate from the Unit will not share in Unit production and vice versa.

It is our understanding that the area which would be taken out of the unit does not include any state lands. It includes some private lands, but the majority of the lands are federal. Since the State's property rights are not affected, we believe any demand must be originated by the USGS.







Proposed Contraction San Juan 30-4 Unit Rio Arriba County New Mexico

We have reviewed recent correspondence, and particularly the letter of December 3, 1975 from William F. Carr, General Counsel for the New Mexico Oil and Gas Conservation Commission concerning contraction of the San Juan 30-4 Unit.

While we agree that the unit agreement gives the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission the power to request contraction of the Unit Area, this is a power which may not be exercised arbitrarily. There must be a reason. The proposed contraction must accomplish some proper purpose. Since no State of New Mexico lands are involved, the only proper purpose the Commission can have is a conservation purpose, i.e., either prevention of waste or the protection of correlative rights. We think that before the Unit Operator can be required by the Commission to initiate a contraction, it should be entitled to be told how the Commission believes the contraction will prevent waste, or will protect correlative rights otherwise the Unit Operator, and the other working interest owners have no way of knowing why the contraction is requested, or whether the Commission is seeking to accomplish a proper purpose, or what sort of evidence the working interest owners should furnish to show that waste will not be prevented or correlative rights protected by the proposed contraction.

We believe that the Commission should be advised that we do not believe that the proposed contraction will either prevent waste or protect correlative rights, and we therefore request that it advise the Unit Operator of the purpose of the proposed contraction, and how in the Commission's opinion it will accomplish that purpose, so we may know how to answer its demand.

We represent Cecilia Wirt Simms, the mineral owner under an oil and gas lease covering 1601.41 acres which has been committed to the above unit. 11.04 acres under the lease are within a Pictured Cliffs participating area and have been in the participating area since 1958. The remaining 1,590.37 acres under the lease are undeveloped and not within any participating area. We attach a plat which shows the participating areas, the tracts totaling 1,601.41 acres under the Simms' lease, and the acreage which was automatically eliminated from the unit in 1958.

Only one well has been drilled since 1961. El Paso Natural Gas Company, the unit operator, has submitted for approval a 1975 drilling program which contemplates the drilling of four Pictured Cliffs wells within the established Pictured Cliffs participating area. The proposed plan of development, in fact all plans of development since 1960, is not satisfactory from the standpoint of our client. It is obvious that neither the unit operator nor the Simms' lessee (Amoco Production Company) intends to carry out a program of development which would be beneficial to the Simms' mineral interest.
