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MR. STAMETS: We will call Case 6124.

MS. TESCHENDORF: Case 6124, Application of HNG Oil Company for a unit agreement, Lea County, New Mexico.

MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, I'm William F. Carr of Catron, Catron and Sawtell, Santa Fe and I have one witness to be sworn.

(THEREUPON, the witness was duly sworn.)

MICHAEL SHEARN

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. CARR:

- Q Will you please state your name and residence?
- A My name is Michael Shearn, S-h-e-a-r-n, and I live in El Paso, Texas.
 - Q Mr. Shearn, by whom are you employed?
 - A I'm self-employed.
 - Q What is your relationship with HNG in this case?
- A I'm in partnership with Saul West, in turn we are in partnership with HNG.
- Q Mr. Shearn, have you previously testified before this Commission and had your credentials accepted and made a matter of record?

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A	Ι	have	not	testified.
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- Q Will you briefly state your educational background and work experience?
- A I have a B.A. in psychology. I graduated in 1957 from the University of Texas at El Paso. I went to work for a B. M. Keohane, K-e-o-h-a-n-e, in Roswell, New Mexico, who is an oil producer and I worked three years until 1960. Since 1960 I have been actively engaged in the oil business, production, leasing, royalties.
- Q Mr. Shearn, are you familiar with the application filed in this case?

A I am.

Q Are you familiar with the area that is to be unitized?

A I am.

MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, are Mr. Shearn's credentials acceptable as an operator?

MR. STAMETS: I presume you are seeking to qualify
Mr. Shearn as a practical oil man?

MR. CARR: That's right.

MR. STAMETS: He does appear to be so qualified.

- Q (Mr. Carr continuing.) Mr. Shearn, what is HNG seeking to accomplish with this application?
 - A The formation of an exploratory unit.
 - Q Have you prepared or has there been prepared under

- A Yes, there has.
- Q I would ask you to refer to what has been marked for identification as Exhibit Number One and identify this for the Examiner?
- A This is the unit agreement for the development and operation of the Shoebar Ranch Unit Area, Lea County, New Mexico.
- Q Does this unit agreement contain as Exhibit A an ownership plat?
 - A It does.
- Q Will you refer to that plat and tell the Examiner what it shows?
- A Exhibit A refers to the lease ownership and leases committed to the State unit.
 - Q How many acres are within the unit?
 - A A hundred and sixty-one acres.
- Q Does the unit agreement also contain an acreage breakdown?
 - A Yes, it does, Exhibit B.
 - Q That's Exhibit B to the Unit?
- A Yes.
- Q Has the form of this agreement been approved by the State Land Office as to form?

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- Q And is the letter approving this marked Exhibit

 Two for introduction in this case?
 - A It is.
- Q Does the unit agreement provide for submission of plans for unit development to the Oil Conservation Commission?
 - A It does.
- Q Do you have any objection to the Oil Commission order requiring the submission of such plans?
 - A No, I do not.
- Q What is the present commitment of acreage to the Shoebar Ranch Unit Agreement?
 - A A hundred percent.
 - Q Is there any Federal or Fee land in this unit?
 - A There is not.
 - O It is all State land?
 - A All State land.
- Q In the unit agreement is Houston Natural Gas, or HNG, designated the unit operator?
 - A They are.
 - Q When do you hope to drill a test well on this unit?
- A The first week in February.
- Q And whereabouts do you propose to drill this well?
- A We propose to drill it six hundred and sixty feet
 from the north, nineteen hundred and eighty feet from the

west of Section 3 of 17 South, 35 East.

- Q And to what depth do you intend to drill?
- A Fourteen thousand feet, through the Pennsylvanian sand.
 - Q And what formations do you seek to unitize?
 - A All formations.
- Q I would ask you to refer to what has been marked for identification as Exhibit Number Three and explain to the Examiner what it is and what it shows?

MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, we have only one copy of this exhibit and Mr. Shearn will have to come to the front of the table.

A At the bottom of the unit is a location as to township and range and an outline of the unit. There is a reflection or reference to Western Natural Gas in Section 35 of 16, 35 at which we tied the log from that well that had been drilled and penetrated the formations we are seeking. We also tied in the well, the Western Natural Gas well in Section 34 of 16, 35 which by our geologic interpretation is on the down thrown side of a fault. What is shown in the Western Natural Gas well is that the formations we are seeking were high or absent or very thin. As you cross the fault there has been a depositional buildup coming over from the Mobil well we are tying to over to the west, which is in the Vacuum field and it shows that as this depositional buildup

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against the fault there is definite porosity and permeability in the Pennsylvanian series, the Morrow formation to be exact, and it gives us a good possibility to pick up--well, we have possibilities beginning at the San Andres through the Morrow and this is our thinking. We are not more specific because it's a regional trend.

Q Mr. Shearn, in your opinion will approval of the proposed unit promote the prevention of waste and the protection of correlative rights?

A Absolutely.

Q Were Exhibits One through Three prepared by you or under your direction and supervision or have you reviewed them and can you testify from your own knowledge that they are accurate and correct?

A I can testify.

MR. CARR: At this time, Mr. Examiner, I would offer Applicant's Exhibits One through Three.

MR. STAMETS: The Exhibits will be admitted.

(THEREUPON, Applicant's Exhibits One through

Three were admitted into evidence.)

MR. CARR: I have no further questions on direct.

MR. STAMETS: Are there any questions of the

witness? He may be excused.

(THEREUPON, the witness was excused.)

MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, inasmuch as HNG would like

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to drill the well the first week in February, we would request that the order be expedited.

MR. STAMETS: We will see what we can do for you, Mr. Carr.
