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MR. NUTTER: The hearing will come to order, please.

The first case this morning will be Case Number 6880.

MR. PADILLA: Application of Union Oil Company of California for a unit agreement, Lea County, New Mexico.

MR. JENNINGS: I'm James T. Jennings,

Jennings and Christy, of Roswell, appearing on behalf of

Union Oil Company, and I'll have two witnesses, Mr. Robert

Lockhart and Mr. John Moffitt.

(Witnesses sworn.)

### ROBERT LOCKHART

being called as a witness and having been duly sworn upon his oath, testified as follows, to-wit:

#### DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. JENNINGS:

Would you state your name and occupation,
please, sir?

A. My name is Robert Lockhart. I'm employed by Union Oil Company of California in Midland, Texas, as the Midland District Manager of Land.

Q.

1 Q. Mr. Lockhart, are you familiar with the 2 application that's been filed in Case 6880? A. Yes, sir, I am. Generally explain the nature of this Q. 5 application. 6 We are seeking approval for our proposed 7 West Lynch Deep Unit agreement, covering 1280 acres of land 8 in Township 20 South, Range 34 East. The unit area is com-9 posed of 1280 acres made up of all of Section 28, east half 10 of Section 29, and the north half of Section 33. Of the 11 total unit area 960 acres, or 75 percent, is composed of 12 Federal lands; the remaining 320 acres, or 25 percent of the 13 total unit area, is made up of fee lands. There are no 14 State lands in the proposed unit outline. 15 Q, Mr. Lockhart, what percentage of the 16 lands do you have committed to the unit? 17 100 percent of the lands are committed A. 18 to the unit at the present time. There are only three parties involved, Q. 20 isn't that true? 21 Yes, sir. A. 22 Would you name them, please? Q. 23 Union Oil Company of California, The A. 24 Superior Oil Company, and Kenneth G. Cohn.

I hand you what has been referred to as

Union's Exhibit Number One and ask you to identify that.

A. Yes, sir, this is our proposed unit agreement, standard form 30.

Q. Is Exhibit A attached to the unit reflecting the plat of your proposed unit area in respect to leases?

A. Exhibit A is the plat of the unit area,

and there is also an Exhibit B, which is a schedule of owner-ship of lands within the unit area.

Q. And I think you stated Union will be the operator?

A. Yes, sir.

Mr. Lockhart, is this acreage in the
potash area?

A. Yes, sir, it is. It is in -- the location does fall within the R-lll area.

Q And have you given notice to the potash leaseholders?

A. Yes, notice has been given.

Q. And what were the results of this notice?

A. Well, we've received back from the -from the three parties involved we've received waivers from
two of the parties. There is one waiver that we have not
received as of Monday, or yesterday. Excuse me, Tuesday.

Q. I hand you what has been marked Exhibit

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BY MR. NUTTER:

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2 Yes, sir. This is a letter that's dated 3 April 22nd, 1980, from the USGS Albuquerque Office, giving preliminary clearance to proceed with the formation of our proposed unit area, subject to our submitting in a sufficient 6 amount of time an approved unit agreement. 7 Our unit is being formed for a 14,800 8 foot Siluro-Devonian test located in the southwest quarter 9 of the southeast quarter of Section 28. 10 0. Do you have a secondary objective? 11 Yes, sir, the Morrow formation would be A. 12 our secondary objective. 13 Without going into details to the bench-0. 14 mark, what is the depths covered by the unit? 15 The unit will basically cover all depths A. 16 below the Seven Rivers formation. It is a deep unit, 17 Mr. Lockhart, in your opinion will the approval of the unit be in the interest of conservation and prevent waste? Yes, sir. A. MP. JENNINGS: I believe that's all the questions I have.

Q. Mr. Lockhart, when you stated you had waivers from two out of three of the potash owners in the area, --

A. Yes, sir.

Q -- did you mean to the -- you notified them you were forming the unit or you notified them of the --

A. Yes, sir. Yes, sir, the location of the

Q. I see.

A. And we're expecting, you know, expecting to hear from the third company. I think their time was up Monday. They could have put a letter in the mail, you know, Monday, and we haven't received it yet.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of Mr. Lockhart? He may be excused.

MR. JENNINGS: Mr. Moffitt.

#### JOHN MOFFITT

being called as a witness and having been duly sworn upon his oath, testified as follows, to-wit:

#### DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MP. JENNINGS:

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Page . Mr. Moffitt, would you please state your Q. full name, occupation, and place of residence? My name is John Moffitt. I'm District A. Exploration Manager for Union Oil Company of California in Midland, Texas. It's my understanding that you have not heretofore testified before this Division. That's correct. A. Have you testified on many occasions be-0. fore other regulatory commissions? Yes, I have, in other states. A. Have your qualifications been accepted Q. there?

A. Yes, they were.

Q Just briefly cover your educational back-ground and your degree.

A. I graduated from Oklahoma University in 1948 with a BS degree in geology and upon leaving school I worked as a gas engineer and drilling engineer for Republic Natural Gas Company.

I joined Union Oil Company slightly over twenty-eight years ago and have worked in a number of states, the latest assignment being Midland, Texas, for the past seventeen years.

Q. And what is your position at this time in

MP. JENNINGS: Are the witness' qualifications accepted?

MR. NUTTER: Yes, they are.

First, Mr. Moffitt, if you would just Q. outline to the Commission the formations which you propose to unitize in this well.

We propose to unitize all formations essentially below the Seven Rivers to the, and including, the Siluro-Devonian at a depth of 14,800 feet.

I have an exhibit that will illustrate better the limit, the upper limit of that unit.

Q. Mr. Moffitt, I hand you what has been marked as Union's Exhibit Number Three and ask you to identify that and to explain it.

Exhibit Number Three is a seismic struc-A. ture map constructed by R. H. Adams of our Midland office This interpretation shows a closed under my direction. structural feature centering in Section 28 of Township 20 South, Range 34 East. The interpretation indicates approxi-

mately or slightly over 200 feet of closure, and probably less than 300 feet of closure, at the Siluro-Devonian level.

The red dot on the exhibit is the proposed location for a 14,800 foot Siluro-Devonian test. Secondary objectives are the Morrow Sands. Other formations that may be productive in the area are the Delaware Sands, Bone Spring, Wolfcamp, and Pennsylvanian limestones.

The lowest closing contour on this interpretation is included within the proposed unit. It is a red outline.

The orange line on here is a stratigraphic cross section that will be shown as another exhibit of two deep wells in the area. These are the only deep ones -- these are the nearest deep wells. There is one other deep well to the north in Section 14.

Q. I now hand you what has been marked as Union's Exhibit Four and ask if you'd identify that and what it reflects?

A. Exhibit Number Four is a structure contour map on the top of the Lower Morrow, constructed by C. E. Singletary of our Midland District Office under my direction.

This map utilizes the seismic interpretation and the top of the Lower Morrow as found in the three previous mentioned wells.

The structural closure on the Morrow is

Again, the lowest closest contour on the

generally somewhat less than that shown at the Silurian level, Siluro-Devonian level, and this interpretation indicates we anticipate about 100 feet, or slightly over 100 feet, of closure.

Morrow interpretation is included within the proposed unit.

MR. NUTTER: These are 100 foot contours

on both these exhibits?

A. Yes, there are 100 foot on both.

Q. I now hand you what has been marked as Exhibit Number Five and ask you to identify that, please.

A. Exhibit Number Five is a stratigraphic cross section using the logs of the Morrow section and the Siluro-Devonian section of the two previous mentioned wells, the Cities Service No. 1-Y Government "N" Well in Section 19 and the Pennzoil No. 1 Federal "C" in Section 35. Both of these wells penetrated thick Morrow Sands that have gas shows but they were not productive. We anticipate that better porosity and permeability will be encountered in the Morrow Sands over this Siluro-Devonian structure.

The Siluro-Devonian horizon, we anticipate -- this is shown at the bottom of the cross section in blue, and it shows the testing in the two wells prior to their abandonment. Both wells recovered some water from the Siluro-Devonian, and with our structural position we anticipate the siluro-Devonian.

Rt. 1 Box 193-B Santa Fe, New Mexico 8750 Phone (505) 455-7409 pated that the Siluro-Devonian will be oil productive similar to the Lea Devonian Field 3-1/2 miles to the northeast.

Q. I now hand you what has been marked as Union Exhibit Number Six and ask you to identify that and tell us what it reflects.

A. Exhibit Number Six is a portion of the up-hole log of the Cities Service Government "N" No. 1-Y
Well in Section 19. This was a nearby well in which we could designate the unit outlined.

Lynch Field is marked on this log, although this well was not productive in the shallow. As you can see, it was drilled to a total depth of 15,124 feet, but the field is productive within the interval marked on the section from about 3440 on down to 3560, and for our purposes the marker that we have selected on this log is at 3998, 318 feet below the top of the Seven Rivers. This marker is easily correlatable in the area and this occurs also in the Pennzoil well in Section 35, and the unit will be limited to the depth below this marker, as set out by this log.

A. There is shallow production on this section, yes, sir.

Q. Mr. Moffitt, in your opinion will the

unit prevent waste and protect the correlative rights within the unit area?

A. Yes, it will.

Q. Were Exhibits Three, Four, Five, and Six prepared by you or under your supervision?

A. Yes, sir, they were.

MR. JENNINGS: We have nothing further to offer. We would offer Exhibits One through Six at this time.

MR. NUTTER: Exhibits One through Six will be admitted in evidence.

#### CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

Q Mr. Moffitt, I presume that both this

1-Y Cities Service Well and the Pennzoil Well both recovered
water from the Siluro-Devonian, is that it?

A. Yes, sir, they did.

Q. And you're expecting that you may have a little high in between these two wells to be above the water table in the Devonian?

A. Yes, sir. We think we do have a closed structural feature that should be oil production.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of Mr. Moffitt? He  $_{\mbox{\scriptsize may}}$  be excused.
