

1 WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 2 10:35 a.m.: 3 EXAMINER STOGNER: At this time I'll call Case 4 Numbers 11,257 and 11,258, which are both in the matter of 5 6 the hearing called by the Oil Conservation Division to 7 permit the operator, A.L. Dawsey, and all other interested parties to appear and show cause why two certain wells in 8 9 the Tierra Amarilla Land Grant in Rio Arriba County, New 10 Mexico, should not be properly plugged and abandoned in 11 accordance with the OCD procedures. 12 At this time I'll call for appearances. 13 MR. CARROLL: Rand Carroll on behalf of the Oil 14 Conservation Division. 15 I have one witness to be sworn. 16 EXAMINER STOGNER: Any other? 17 There being none, Mr. Carroll, you have one 18 witness? 19 MR. CARROLL: Yes. 20 EXAMINER STOGNER: And he is being represented 21 here via telephone from Aztec, New Mexico; is that right? 22 That is correct. MR. CARROLL: 23 EXAMINER STOGNER: At this time I'm going to ask 24 our court reporter to swear Mr. Robinson in. 25 (Thereupon, the witness was sworn.)

EXAMINER STOGNER: Thank you, Johnny. 1 Mr. Carroll? 2 JOHNNY ROBINSON (Present by telephone), 3 the witness herein, after having been first duly sworn upon 4 his oath, was examined and testified as follows: 5 DIRECT EXAMINATION 6 7 BY MR. CARROLL: Mr. Robinson, will you please state your name, 8 Q. 9 your employer and your position with that employer for the 10 record? 11 Α. My name is Johnny Robinson, with the Aztec Oil 12 Conservation, Field Rep 2. Have you had a chance to testify before this 13 Q. Division before and had your qualifications accepted as a 14 witness? 15 16 Α. Yes, I have. And have you had the opportunity to review the 17 Q. OCD files maintained in the cases before the Examiner 18 today? 19 Yes, sir. 20 Α. 21 MR. CARROLL: Are the witness's qualifications 22 acceptable, Mr. Examiner? 23 EXAMINER STOGNER: They are. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, are the files 24 0. 25 that you reviewed maintained by the OCD in its ordinary

course of business?

A. Yes, sir, they are.

MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, and Mr. Robinson, I'd refer both of you to what has been marked as OCD Exhibits

Numbers 1 and 2.

Number 1 is the file maintained by the Oil Conservation Division regarding the El Vado Well Number 1.

And Exhibit Number 2 is the file maintained on the El Vado Well Number 2.

- Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, for the Examiner, could you briefly go over the well histories for these two wells?
- A. Okay, what we have is the normal paperwork as far as the C-101 for the permit to drill, a 102 for the dedication plat.

Then we have some C-103s, and they're not complete. Most of the information that we have has been -They were never turned in or reported, and the information that we have is just kind of by word of mouth from Charles Gholson to the operator.

And there's several inspections and some noncompliance letters where we have asked for different information, and the information was never turned in.

And then some of the notes on the -- from Charles
Gholson -- describes the completion of the wells, as to

what the company person told him. 1 Mr. Robinson, when was the last production from 2 these wells? 3 The El Vado 1 was -- When they drilled the well 4 Α. they logged the well, and it was determined to be a 5 dryhole. 6 So there was never any production. 7 0. And when was it drilled? 8 It was first drilled in -- 1987. Let's see, Α. 9 1986. 10 11 And it was determined to be a dryhole at that Q. 12 time? Right. 13 Α. Has any further effort been made to bring this 14 Q. 15 well onto production? No, sir. 16 Α. 17 Okay. And as to the El Vado Well Number 2, when Q. 18 is the last production from that well? 19 Α. The El Vado 2 was -- As I understand it, it was 20 tested, and there was not any production. And when was it tested? 21 Q. 198- -- Let me see, let me get that over here. 22 Α. 1987. 23 24 Q. And Mr. Robinson, is the current condition of 25 these wells such that the OCD recommends plugging these

7 wells in order to protect fresh water, the public health 1 and the environment and prevent waste and protect 2 correlative rights? 3 Due to the incomplete paperwork that's been 4 Α. turned in, I feel like it is. 5 6 Has the OCD come up with a recommended plugging procedure to plug these wells? 7 8 Α. Yes, sir. And where is that plugging procedure contained? Q. 9 Is it contained in these exhibits? 10 11 Α. Let's see, it's in Exhibit Number 4. 12 Q. Mr. Robinson, what I have here marked as Exhibit 13 Number 4 is the copies of the notice sent out to the parties -- oh, I see what -- You're referring to the cover 14 15 sheet of Exhibit 1 and 2, which is part of the well file, but it refers to different exhibits, so it's actually 16 Exhibit Number 1 and 2, and we will look through it to find 17 the correct pages to refer the Examiner to. 18 What I'm looking at, on the cover sheet it says 19 20 Exhibit Number 4-A, and then on the paperwork that's 21

- supplied it's on page 19.
  - Page 19 of Exhibit 1? 0.

Well, my paperwork shows Exhibit 4. Α.

24 MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, it's page 19 of 25 Exhibit Number 1. Pages 18 and 19 of Exhibit Number 1.

And pages 19 and 20 on Exhibit EXAMINER STOGNER: 1 2. 2 MR. CARROLL: Okay. 3 (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson are there bonds 4 Q. covering these wells? 5 There were bonds in -- They were assigned from 6 First National Bank of Albuquerque, which is First Security 7 Bank. 8 Q. And Mr. Robinson, I'll refer both you and the Examiner to what has been marked as OCD Exhibit Number 3, 10 and go on and finish your testimony regarding these bonds. 11 12 Mr. Robinson, were there two \$5000 bonds, one \$5000 bond for each of the wells? 13 Yes, sir, there were. And those bonds were 14 Α. released July the 9th, 1987. 15 They were released by the bank holding? Q. 16 Right. 17 Α. And why were they released? Do you know? 18 Q. No, they were released without approval. 19 Α. MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, if I could refer you 20 to page 14 of Exhibit Number 3, which is correspondence 21 from First Security Bank, formerly First National Bank, 22 which states that the bank -- These bonds matured back in 23 24 1987, and no one claimed them, and the bonds escheated to

the State of New Mexico in July of 1993.

The bank sent the OCD documentation which would allow the OCD to file the appropriate documentation with the State of New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department for return of these funds.

So this documentation shows that this well -these wells are not currently covered by bonds, but there
is an avenue for the OCD to pursue getting the two \$5000
bonds back from the State Taxation and Revenue Department.

- Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, what efforts were made by the OCD to contact Mr. Dawsey to get him to plug the wells?
- A. I sent a certified letter to him, and it was received, and there was never any -- I was never contacted as to what he wanted to do with the wells.

MR. CARROLL: Mr. Examiner, it's not part of the record but the OCD did receive a call from Mr. Dawsey wondering what happened to his bonds, and that's why the OCD has been in contact with the First Security Bank. And I just outline -- Page 14 of Exhibit Number 3 shows what happened to Mr. Dawsey's bonds.

I'll refer the Examiner to what has been marked OCD Exhibit Number 4, which are copies of certified letters sent to Mr. Dawsey and First Security Bank of Albuquerque, notifying those parties of today's hearing, and also copies of the return receipts which were signed.

T	Q. (By Mr. Carroll) Mr. Robinson, do you have
2	anything further to add in this case?
3	A. No, I don't know of anything.
4	MR. CARROLL: With that, I have nothing further
5	of this witness, and I would move what have been marked OCD
6	Exhibit Numbers 1 through 4 into the record.
7	EXAMINER STOGNER: Exhibits 1 through 4 will be
8	admitted into evidence at this time.
9	EXAMINATION
10	BY EXAMINER STOGNER:
11	Q. Mr. Robinson, I guess I'm a little confused about
12	Mr. Dawsey's whereabouts. Have you been in contact with
13	him?
14	A. No, sir, I haven't. I've tried to call him, and
15	I couldn't get in contact with him.
16	They did receive my letter in Dallas.
17	Q. Whenever you call, what are you told?
18	A. I never did get a phone number. Evidently, it's
19	not a listed number.
20	EXAMINER STOGNER: Mr. Carroll, I don't see any
21	documentation here of our correspondence with the Taxation
22	and Revenue. Will that be forthcoming? About securing the
23	money?
24	MR. CARROLL: Yeah, that hasn't been done yet,
25	and the OCD fully intends to pursue that avenue of

1	retrieving the two \$5000 bonds which escheated to the State
2	back in 1993.
3	EXAMINER STOGNER: In looking at that, Mr.
4	Carroll, should the State of New Mexico have been named on
5	the advertisement for today's case and notified?
6	MR. CARROLL: I do not believe so, Mr. Examiner.
7	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay.
8	MR. CARROLL: The State really I do not see
9	how the State of New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department
10	has an interest in the well where they would have to be
11	notified as to why the well should not be plugged.
12	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay. Does anybody else have
13	anything further in this case?
14	Or do you have any other questions of Mr.
15	Robinson?
16	MR. CARROLL: No, I do not.
17	EXAMINER STOGNER: Mr. Robinson, do you have
18	anything further at this time?
19	THE WITNESS: No, sir, I don't.
20	EXAMINER STOGNER: Okay, then I will excuse Mr.
21	Robinson at this time. Thank you, sir.
22	THE WITNESS: Thank you.
23	MR. CARROLL: Thanks, John.
24	EXAMINER STOGNER: Does anybody else have
25	anything further in either Case 11,257 or 11,258?

1	Then both of these cases will be taken under	
2	advisement.	
3	With that, hearing adjourned.
