WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 1 9:04 a.m.: 2 Good morning, this is the Oil 3 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Conservation Commission. My name is Bill LeMay, Chairman 4 of the Commission. To my left, Commissioner Bill Weiss. 5 To my right, Commissioner Jami Bailey representing the 6 Commissioner of Public Lands, State of New Mexico. Also 7 our secretary Florene Davidson, and our attorney Lyn 8 Hebert. Welcome. We shall start with a little business. 10 I'll entertain a motion to okay the minutes of 11 the previous meeting. 12 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move acceptance of the 13 minutes. 14 COMMISSIONER WEISS: 15 Second. 16 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Thank you. It's been moved and 17 seconded. The minutes of the previous meeting are approved and accepted. 18 19 20 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: We'll also take some final 21 action on Case Number 11,510, which was the Application of 22 Branko, Inc., to reopen Case Number 10,656. That was the 23 Application of Mitchell Energy for compulsory pooling and 24 unorthodox well location in Lea County, New Mexico.

April, the chambers were not 2 available; they were in May. 3 So we will hold our May 22nd Oil Conservation 4 Commission hearing at City Hall, in the chambers there, on 5 the 22nd of May, Roswell. 6 The other dates, we have some changes. 7 The June Commission hearing will be changed to 8 9 June 5th, because one of the Commissioners cannot make the 10 19th, so we'll have June 5th. 11 And then these are some tentative dates for the remainder of the year. Commission hearings will be held on 12 July 17th, August 14th, September 25th, October 16th, 13 14 November 13th and December 11th. So those are tentative dates. All those except 15 16 for the May hearing are scheduled to be held right here in 17 Santa Fe. We may take one of those out in the field, we'll 18 see, see how the Roswell hearing goes. 

WHEREUPON, the following proceedings were had at 9:10 a.m.:

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Well, good morning, and glad to see such a good turnout, considering the weather out there.

This is the Oil Conservation Commission monthly meeting. My name is Bill LeMay, Chairman of the Commission. To my left, Commissioner Bill Weiss. To my right, Commissioner Jami Bailey representing the Commissioner of Public Lands, State of New Mexico.

And we've got a pretty interesting program, I think, because this is the Commission Listens yearly event where you all produce some suggestions to us on what you'd like to see us do.

In the back there, I've got a sheet there, if you haven't seen any. It's a handout concerning last year's results, basically, of what you recommended that we undertake. And I'll go over this when we get to that portion of the meeting, to kind of show you that we're adopting most of what you come up with. So, you know, from that point of view I think it's important that you all continue this dialogue with us, because your ideas are good. And as shown by our action, we're adopting almost everything that makes sense.

Let's begin by conducting some business here.

First, I have the minutes of the previous meeting. Is

there a motion to accept the minutes? 1 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I move we accept. 2 COMMISSIONER WEISS: I second. 3 Second. It's moved and 4 CHAIRMAN LEMAY: seconded. All in favor say "aye". 5 6 COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Aye. COMMISSIONER WEISS: 7 Aye. CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Opposed? Fortunately, all three 8 of us agree. 9 * * * 10 Also of note here is -- Today I signed the Open 11 Meetings Resolution, which conforms with the State Open 12 Meetings Act, whereby we give notices to all our meetings 13 and conduct all our meetings according to the sunshine 14 We do that every year, and every year we adopt the 15 Open Meeting Resolution to conform with the Open Meetings 16 Act. So let the record show that's been done. 17 18 The other item of business was taking final 19 20 action on Case Number 11,352, Order Number 10,766, which is 21 an Application by the Oil Conservation Division to amend 22 Rule 116 of its General Rules and Regulations, pertaining 23 to leaks, spills, blowouts.

And as a companion case, separate, but testimony

Number 11,352, Order Number 10,766, again the Application of the Oil Conservation Division to amend leaks and spills, but also to adopt a separate rule which, in turn, brought over the -- the rules and regulations at the Water Quality Control Commission over here -- I gave the wrong case.

That case is 11,635, and Order Number 10,767. What that did is just establish methods and standards for prevention and abatement of water pollution that's associated with oilfield operations.

In essence, that particular order amended Rule 7 of our Rules and Regulations and also adopted a new Rule 19, which was the standards, the Water Quality Control Commission -- that has brought those standards over here to the Oil Conservation Division and Commission so we have jurisdiction over that particular rule.

And I'd like to first turn it over to

Commissioner Weiss, anything he'd have to say about the -both orders.

COMMISSIONER WEISS: I have one comment. I was pleased to see that we recognize risk now, rather than -In my mind, that says that there's a difference between spilling the tank water, a tank load of produced water at Taos along the river, and in Jal. So I think that's in the order.

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Fine. Commissioner Bailey, you

COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I'm particularly pleased that there is one reporting form the industry can use for reporting to the OCD, to the State Land Office and to the

5 BLM. I believe that consolidation and lack of duplicative

6 paperwork will be helpful.

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Good. And you were favorably impressed with the order and your intention to sign it?

COMMISSIONER BAILEY: I intend to sign the order.

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: Commissioner Weiss, is that also your intent?

COMMISSIONER WEISS: Yes, sign the order.

CHAIRMAN LEMAY: As it is mine. And there again,

I think because there was such a good cooperative effort

Now, everyone isn't going to get what they want, that's not the case. But what happened is, there's enough input and there's enough information there, there's enough consensus that we think we've arrived at a -- you know, pretty good rules. We took about 7, Rule 119 and 116. So there again, the congratulations go out to you all who participated in that effort, along with the staff of the

OCD.

And it also is my intent to sign the order too. So let the record show that final action has been taken at this meeting on those two cases.

Okay, is there any other business that you can think of that needs to be performed?

Okay, we'll get into the docket per se.
