As wells mature, shut-in periods of any duration may require substantial efforts to return those wells to production (protracted field personnel attention, blowing to pit, soaping. swabbing, etc.). In extreme cases, shut-in may jeopardize the recovery of all remaining reserves due to an inability to re-establish commercial producing rates. Producers are all constantly attempting to operate more intelligently and economically to continue to deliver natural gas to the consumer.

Based upon these concerns, Samson Resources Company would urge the Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department to repeal Division Rule 302.
