Dear Mr. Armstrong:

We have determined that under existing conditions the Poker Lake Unit CVX JV PB No. 8H well is **not** capable of producing unitized substances from the Second Bone Spring Sand (a member of the Bone Spring Formation) in unit paying quantities. The well was completed in the Second Bone Spring Sand on January 11, 2015. Since the well was determined to be a nonpaying unit well, a drilling and spacing unit must be established for the well so that a communitization agreement can be approved by the Carlsbad Field Office.
