DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Mudded back and bridged hole at 1880' and dumped 10 sacks mixed cement. Ripped 8-5/8" casing 61' above 1440' casing point, and pulled 8-5/8" casing leaving 61' in hole; then placed heavy mud to approximately 830' and run 10 sacks mixed cement; ripped 10-3/4" casing above the casing point 30' and pulled 10-3/4" leaving 30' in the hole; placed heavy mud back to 425' and run 10 sacks mixed cement and pulled 12 1/2" casing; we then placed heavy mud to top and run 5 sacks cement on top of hole and placed 4" x 4" marker at mouth of well.
