


Glenn-

We have hired a consulting company to execute the workplan you approved in the email below. One thing they brought to my attention was that the workplan narrative proposes four monitoring wells, but the site map depicts five. They thought that wells PMW-3 and PMW-4 were redundant and should be deleted and replaced with a single well about half way between them.

We have confirmation samples taken during the original excavation showing a clean excavation sidewall next to PMW-3.

Dear Mr. Radin:

The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has reviewed Koch's May 2009 investigation work plan for a crude oil and produced water release that was reported via form C-141 on May 17, 2009. This workplan specifies how Koch will investigate ground water that may have been impacted by releases at Koch's Dryden 2E well site.

Koch's work plan is approved with the following conditions (please see OCD's comments on attached pdf copy of workplan):

1. Koch shall allow the monitor wells to recover for at least 24 hours after being completed before purging and sampling ground water.
2. Koch shall analyze the soil samples for TPH using 418.1. Koch is **not** required to analyze the ground water samples for 418.1.
3. Koch's report is due to OCD within 30 days of Koch receiving the lab results. Please provide a copy of the report to both OCD's Santa Fe and Aztec Offices.
4. Koch's report must also include a dip cross-section with the results of the headspace analyses, soil data, ground water data, and the lithology.

Please be advised that OCD's approval does not relieve Koch of liability if contamination exists which is beyond the scope of the work plan, if the activities fail to adequately determine the extent of contamination; or if the activities fail to adequately remediate contamination related to



Koch's activities. In addition, OCD's approval does not relieve Koch of responsibility for compliance with any other federal, state, tribal or local laws and regulations.
