Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.*

The drip tank facility was removed from its current location. There was some evidence of oil stained soil beneath the tank when they were removed.

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.*

The drip tank facility has been removed from the current location. The site was remediated by Apex Titan in 2015, impacted material was excavated and transported to Sundance for proper disposal. Confirmation samples were collected and sent to an NMOCD approved laboratory, which determined concentrations of BTEX, TPH and chloride were less than the NMOCD regulatory standards. Subsequently, the site was lined, backfilled and the surface has been restored.
