Dear Mr. King,

Per your recent request please find enclosed the following information and documents.

1. NMOCD 19 NMAC 15.E rule 310 pertaining to dikes and/or fire walls.

Please note if SWD's utilize below grade tanks or pits then they may be required to be permitted under rule 711.

2. Guidelines for Hydrostatic Test Dewatering.

> Please note these type of permits are issued out of the NMOCD Environmental Bureau office in Santa Fe, NM. To obtain a permit please contact Martyne Kieling at 505-827-07153.

> Basically new pipelines using fresh water that discharge less than 100,000 gallons per event can be permitted under a blanket 5 year permit, notwithstanding certain other conditions found in the guidelines.

> While not specifically pointed out in the guidelines the local NMOCD District would like to receive a courtesy call before you actually discharge on each event.

> All other scenarios usually require one-time individual permits before discharging.

Dear Mr. Molnar:

The Oil Conservation Division (OCD) has received Exxon Company, U.S.A. (Exxon) request, dated January 19, 1996, for authorization to discharge approximately 52,500 gallons of waste water from the hydrostatic test of a section of new pipeline (12" line). The proposed location for the discharge is the Avalon (Delaware) Unit, Eddy County, New Mexico.

2"-8" (ine) (15.

Based on the information provided in the request, the hydrostatic test water discharge is hereby approved subject to the following conditions:

1. Fresh water will be used to conduct the test.

2. The pipe must be new and never previously used for hydrocarbon transmission.

- 3. Permission will be obtained from the landowner(s) prior to discharge.
- 4. The test waters will be discharged into the excavated pipe trench for safe settling of the pipe.

Pursuant to WQCC Regulation 3-106.B, this approval will allow Exxon to discharge without an approved discharge plan for a period not to exceed 120 days. If the site is to be used for more than one test discharge, formal reapplication must be made. If the discharge exceeds 120 days, a formal discharge plan must be submitted for review.
