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You will note that the last mentioned C-103 has been approved only
insofar as the temporary abandonment is concerned. Another C-103, Report on
Plugging, will be due after final plugging and after the location is cleared
and levelled.

Approval of this final Plugging Report will be withheld until after
a location inspection has been made by a representative of this office, which
incidentally will be made on James H. Simpson No. 1 location at the same time.

Your attention is also called to Rule 1108 of the Commission's Rules
and Regulations, revised November 21, 1955 by Order R-722, requiring that one
copy of all electrical and radio-activity logs run on a well shall be filed
with the Commission within 20 days after the completion of a well. Said logs
may be kept confidential for a period of 90 days from date of completion of
the well if so requested.

Although your Simpson Well was completed prior to the date of this
requirement, and therefore the logs are not required, copies of logs run on
the Spires Well will be required.
