Your letter of February 6th has been received. When you visit the Adams and McGahey well you can easily find the NE corner of Sec. 16 and tape the location. Mr. Durrin told me the well location was moved East after all the moves you state occurred.

I wonder if you could run a measuring line in the Ledgerwood well and find the fluid level. When I told Kimes of making a complaint to you, he changed his story about the Ledgerwood well standing full of water.

While there, please look over the Silverstine job of plugging. This is one of three wells that has not been plugged.

I am filing suit against the Canadian River Oil Company and all directors. Kimes is one of the directors and he was a witness for Ledgerwood in his lawsuit. By the way, Kimes states Ledgerwood won his suit and Ledgerwood did not have to pay for the well drilling.


I know Donley did not get paid for the Silverstein well; but that does not excuse the turning of all water lose on the salt bed and turning salt water into the fresh strata.

My ~~assignment~~ contract calls for the assignment of the 40 acre lease the Ledgerwood old hole stands on.

If you should run a measuring line in the Ledgerwood well, will you please do the same in the Cornett well drilled by Rip Underwood north of Logan. A stone drops about 700 ft. to fluid in this well.

The Silverstine or Donley well shows it was not plugged by the way it is caving now.
