Liz,

We have received your Sampling Plan Proposal for **Incident #NRM2006358923 Airstream CTB Sample Plan**, thank you.

- Brad Billings has informed us recently that the largest representative area for each composite sample will not exceed 500 ft<sup>2</sup>
- Your plan proposes 32 samples in a specified sampling area of 17802.95 ft<sup>2</sup>
- $17802.95 \text{ ft}^2 / 32 = 556.34 \text{ ft}^2$
- It looks like a lot of time and work went into the sampling plan. All of the coordinates, measurement analyses, and sampling approach have been outlined in the plan
- This composite sample size is relatively close to largest composite sample size that the OCD likes grants, so the sample plan is **approved**
