Brittany,

COG's request for an extension to **February 19th, 2021** is **denied**. **COG** will have 30 days to submit a closure report to the payment portal. The OCD approved the remediation plan October 2nd of 2019. It is important that chloride contaminated soil be removed before it moves down the soil column toward groundwater. Produced water spills need to be cleaned up within the time constraints outlined in the OCD Spill Rule. Please plan accordingly in the future.
