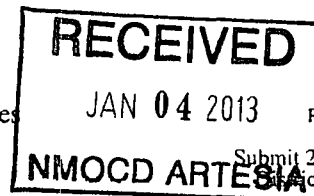

An oil tank overflowed at the Myox 29 State #3H Tank Battery due to a closed equalizer. The equalizer valve has been opened.

Initially 150bbls were released from the oil tank and we were able to recover 148bbls with vacuum trucks. This is a lined facility. All free fluid has been recovered, tank battery equipment has been cleaned, contaminated gravel has been removed, and fresh gravel has been added to the facility as necessary. This facility has been returned to its prior condition.
