Comments on Inspection: Produced fluids pooled at wellhead. Contamination from saturated soils running off down slope on to adjacent Oak Lake 25 Fed #1 location.

Open pit has hydrocarbon contaminated sludge, liner is breached, pit wall has been impacted by contamination from pit sludge. Well is plumbed similar to injection well but current production is being reported.

Tank battery southeast of well has contaminated soils inside the berm with very heavy hydrocarbon smell.

Remediation is required. Contact NMOCD District 2 Environmental Compliance Officer with site ranking and remediation work plan prior to October 21, 2005.

Notify NMOCD District 2 Office 48 hours prior to any remediation work or prior to taking samples where results of the samples may be submitted to OCD.

Comments on Inspection: Produced fluids are flowing out of wellhead onto location, pooling and running off in all directions. Wellhead area has heavy hydrocarbon contamination from past releases with chloride staining also present.

Flow line, approximately 50 feet west of well has leaked and been repaired. Pasture impacted over approximately 25 square foot area at the release point. Contamination has flowed down a natural drainage from the flow line release and contaminated soils for at least 100 yards down this drainage.

Remediation is required. Submit C-141 and contact NMOCD District 2 Environmental Compliance Officer with site ranking and remediation work plan.

Notify NMOCD District 2 Office 48 hours prior to any remediation work or prior to taking samples where results of the samples may be submitted to OCD.

In the event that a satisfactory response is not received to this letter of direction by the "Corrective Action Due By:" date shown above, further enforcement will occur. Such enforcement may include this office applying to the Division for an order summoning you to a hearing before a Division Examiner in Santa Fe to show cause why you should not be ordered to permanently plug and abandon this well. Such a hearing may result in imposition of CIVIL PENALTIES for your violation of OCD rules.
