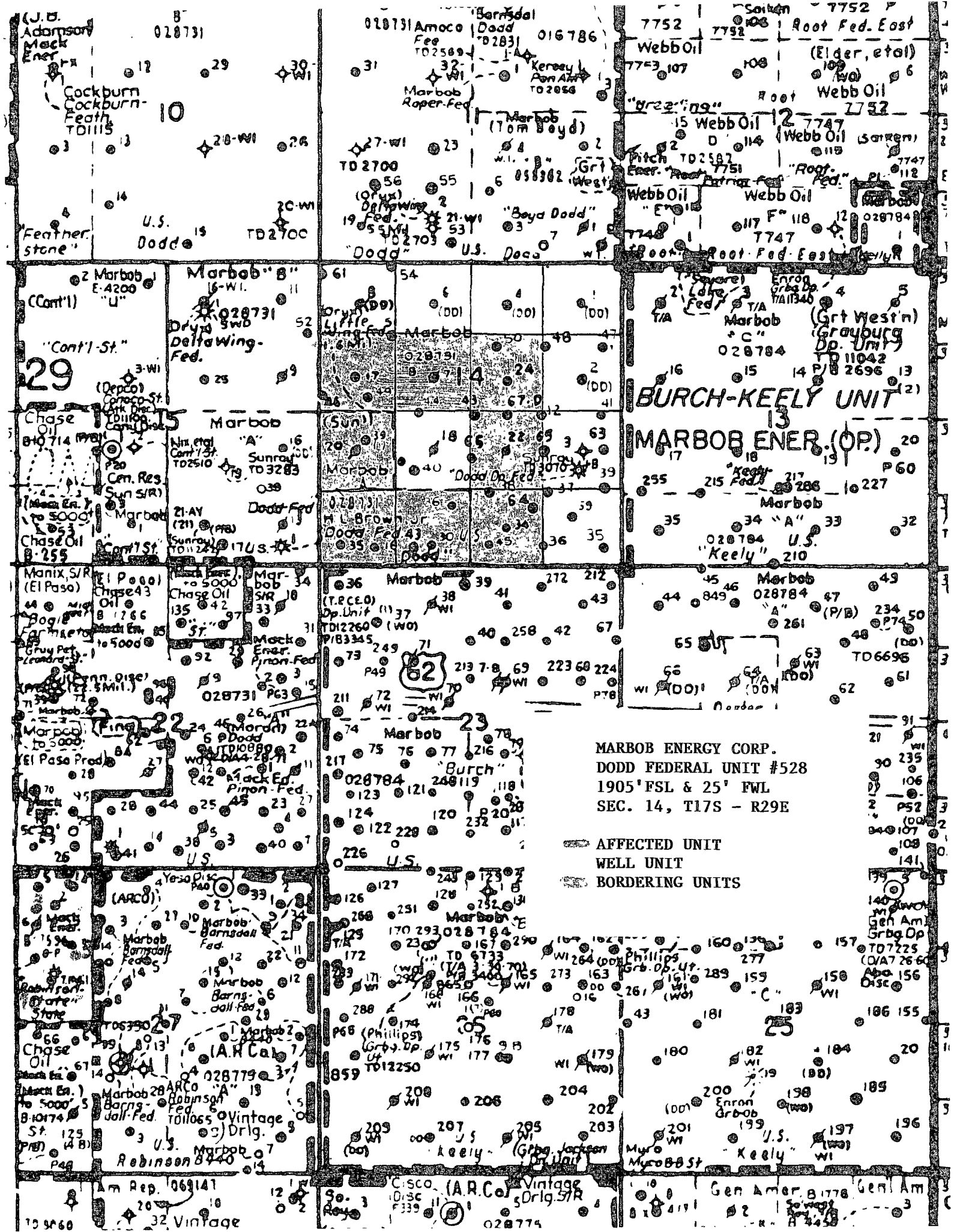

## HYDROGEN SULFIDE PUBLIC PROTECTION PLAN

The purpose of this plan is to safeguard the lives of the public and company personnel in the event of a component failure or natural disaster while oil and gas production operations are in progress.

A copy of this plan shall be available at the Burch Keely Central Tank Battery and Burch Keely Satellite E Battery as well as all the satellites.

### I. Responsibilities and Duties of Key Personnel

The Foreman shall be responsible for overall oil and gas operations, on-site safety, training programs, and for implementing the procedures contained in this plan. In his absence the Assistant Foreman is in charge.

### II. Emergency Call-out Procedures

During normal operations, the unit is controlled by a central alarm that monitors all batteries and satellites. In the event of an H<sub>2</sub>S emergency, Nova Monitoring Systems, Inc. will immediately contact Marbob personnel. In order, persons contacted are as follows:

1. Nature of emergency, especially noting the presence of H<sub>2</sub>S and concentrations of any H<sub>2</sub>S.
2. Whether the emergency is under control or not.
3. Estimated flow rate of hazardous gas.
4. Whether hazardous gas is being flared.
5. Wind direction and velocity
6. Casualties and damage.
