**DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED**  
 The 8 1/4" pipe was set at a depth of 568' and cemented with 50 sacks of cement by Halliburton. The hole was allowed to set for 72 hours. It was then bailed dry and inspection made for leaks. As no leaks developed and the hole remained dry, drilling was resumed.
