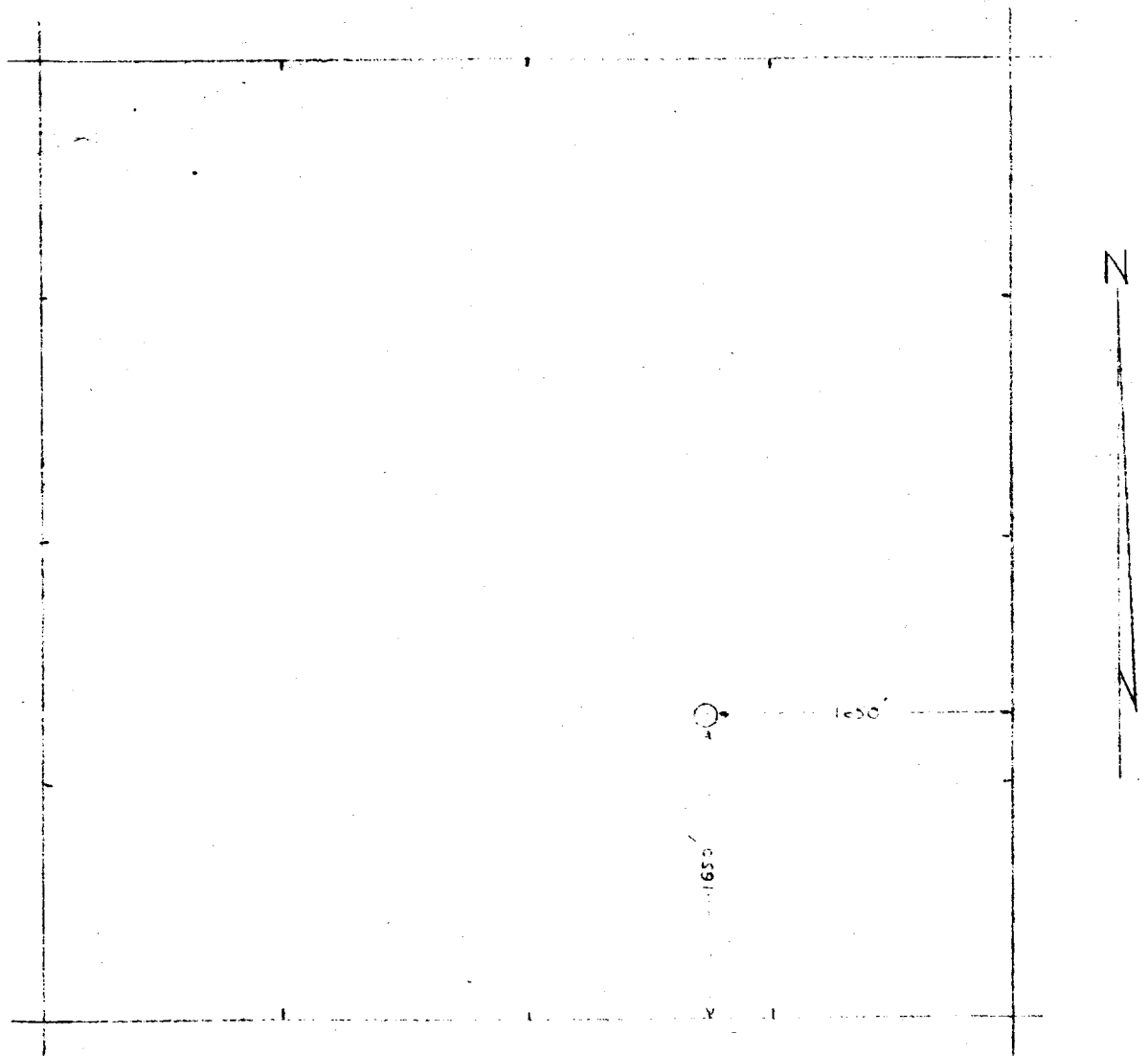

We hereby waive notice of intention to drill on behalf of Claude E. Aikman concerning an oil and gas well to be drilled by Cactus Drilling Company on State Lease No. B-10617, 1650 feet North of the South boundary and 1650 feet West of the East boundary of Section 36, Township 19 South, Range 30 East, N. M. P. M., and consent that said well may be commenced without further notice to us provided the notice of intention to drill is amended to provide that the surface 16 inch casing is set at least 10 feet into the top of the solid salt which we estimate at approximately 625 feet.


Dear Sirs:

Enclosed for you are two copies of a report  
concerning the results of the tests

conducted

The tests were conducted in order to determine  
the effect of the various treatments on the  
growth of the plants. The results show that  
the plants treated with the potassium  
fertilizer showed a marked increase in  
height and weight as compared with the  
control plants. The increase in height  
was particularly noticeable in the  
plants treated with the potassium  
fertilizer. The increase in weight was  
also significant. The results of the tests  
indicate that the potassium fertilizer  
is of great value in promoting the  
growth of the plants. It is recommended  
that the potassium fertilizer be used  
in the future.

Mr. William A. Aikman was in my office this afternoon seeking information relative to the drilling of a Wildcat well in Section 36-19-30, Eddy County.


