Randy,

Cody had talked to me about these wells earlier this week. As I mentioned to you a while back on the phone, we have been planning a revision of the Karst map. Well, that finally happened and we are getting ready to put the new map into use. On the new map, the proposed locations fall under low karst occurrence potential, just barely out of medium. In this area, medium buffers high by 1 mile based on the average dip of the rustler formation. So in summary, this project is in Low, roughly one mile from High. Although this new map is not in use yet, I would not have a problem with a reserve pit from a karst standpoint. However, any other stipulations currently on the permits will stay. When we finalize the new map, it will be put onto the base map CD that we distribute to companies. We will also make sure that the State gets the new information. Since the new map is more precisely drawn, there will not be any exceptions, waivers, or modifications in the future to the "no pit" policy in High Karst. Additionally there will be areas in Medium Karst that pits will also not be allowed in due to minor (if any) top soil and an abundance of at-surface bedrock. Thanks, and I hope this helps.

I understand from Paul Ragsdale of Strata that you need to have your karst team take a look at the proposed use of drilling pits in Sections 23 and 25 T23S R30E to determine if this area, which is labeled as "high cave/karst potential" on the BLM Map, is suitable for such surface pits. The attached document and maps provide a synopsis of published reports and the results of my field investigation of two locations in Section 23. While voids in the underlying Rustler (about 275 feet below land surface at these locations) may exist, we saw no physical evidence of unstable ground in the areas that would preclude the use of surface pits for drilling or holding treated produced water for stimulation (in lieu of using fresh water) at these locations. We also verified that the location of the pits meets all of the setback requirements of the Pit Rule. If BLM has any questions regarding this DRAFT Appendix, please let me know. We anticipate the first sundry notice and pit permit to be submitted to BLM and OCD next week. This Appendix is an integral part of the submission. Two more permits and sundries will follow. Note that Figure 8 of the attachment is the Figure for the permit to show OCD that the area is mapped as "high karst".

This is a DRAFT and we will finalize it when the permit is submitted. If your team has comments, we can incorporate them into the final. Thanks for working with us on these permits as we believe the proper use of pits reduces the environmental footprint of oil and gas development relative to closed loop and haul off.

Attached is the revised diagram showing the layout of the pad and pit. Soil can be stockpiled east of the pad and east of the pit. The rig requires 150-feet to the west of the well and 185 feet to the east. We need 150 feet from the south side of the location to the well and 90 feet from the well to the edge of the pit. Do I need to send this minor change in pad/pit geometry to the adjudication group via regular mail or is transmission to you sufficient?

The very large depth to groundwater, the nature of the stabilized dunes surrounding the area, the lack of surface water, low cave/karst potential and other environmental criteria (including the condition of the roads and truck traffic) make this an excellent location for a reserve pit with on-site burial. Our problem is that we changed the plans to use a pit rather than closed loop a bit late in the game with respect to getting the paperwork through your office – construction on the location is starting in earnest today and the rig will be ready to spud in . I will call Tanner to discuss how we may be able to proceed with what we believe is a better program from an environmental standpoint than the currently approved closed-loop program.

Jim Amos indicated that we do not need to keep him in the loop on this – so he is not copied in this email.

The OCD policy is "first in, first out" with respect to permits. Here is my problem:

- 1. The C-144 pit permit for the Strata Production Roadrunner Federal is 4th "in line" for review in District 2.
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- 3. Due to the constantly changing drilling "schedules", RR Fed #2 is next in line to be drilled with a spud date of about 10 days from now (if the schedule holds).
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- 6. I think the Marbob 10H permit is 3rd in line and we should not need to change that order.
- 7. The last Strata well of their 3 permits will not spud for at least 70 days from today. We would be pleased to ask for a variance to allow OCD more time to review one of the Strata permits so that it is not "deemed denied" if OCD cannot get to the review within 60 days of submission.

Strata plans to use produced water in lieu of fresh water for drilling the marine/producing rocks below the salt. Saving fresh water resources is always a good idea. The drilling summary from the approved APD is attached. I could find zero language that would cause me to think that we need a Sundry to use produced water in lieu of adding salt to fresh water in order to get the correct fluid weight (8.8-9.5 #/gal) and salinity (60-120 K mg/L chloride).

We are alerting BLM of this practice in an abundance of caution. The reserve pit (the NM Pit Rule allows a pit to hold produced water) will be filled with produced water for only few days prior to drilling. The PW in the pit will NOT exhibit floating hydrocarbons. Rig up starts on Friday. Lining the pit is planned for Wednesday.

- Spud in with fresh water spud mud to 250' containing Anco Gel with a viscosity of 30 34 sec/qt. Add 1 sack Drill Paper every connection. Mix Lime for a 9.0 10.0 pH. At TD, sweep the hole with 100 bbls of premixed Anco Gel with a 45 50 sec/qt viscosity prior to tripping out of the hole, to ensure a clean well bore before running casing.
- 2. After setting 13 3/8" surface casing, drill out with native brine. Mix Lime to control the pH at 10.0 10.5. Add 1 gallon Anco Drill N at the flow line every 90' drilled. Add 1 sack Drill Paper every other connection for added hole cleaning and seepage control. Sweep the hole with 50 bbl Anco Salt Gel sweeps with a viscosity of 40 60 sec/qt every 250' drilled for hole cleaning. At interval TD, sweep the hole with 100 bbl Anco Salt Gel with viscosity of 60 80 sec/qt prior to POH to ensure a clean well bore to run intermediate casing.
- 3. After setting 9 5/8" intermediate casing, drill out with cut brine. Mix Lime for 10.0 10.5 pH. Add 1 gallon Anco Drill N at flow line every 90' drilled. Add 1 sack Drill Paper every other connection for seepage control. Sweep the hole with 50 bbl Anco Salt Gel sweeps with a viscosity of 40 60 sec/qt every 250' drilled. At interval TD, circulate a 100 bbls Anco Salt Gel sweep with viscosity of 60 80 sec/qt to ensure a clean well bore prior to running casing.
- 4. After setting 7" casing and prior to drilling the lateral interval, build 9.1 9.5 lb/gal Anco Zan / Starch system in steel pits with cut brine, Anco Zan, Anco Starch White, and Caustic Soda. Mix Anco Zan for a viscosity of 34 38 sec/qt and Yield Point of 6 10 lb/100ft². Mix Anco Starch White API filtrate control of 8 10 ml/30,min. Mix Caustic Soda to control pH at 10.0 10.5. Add WT-22 at 5 gallons per 100 bbls active drilling fluid for control of bacteria. Sweep the hole every 250' drilled with 50 bbls active fluid containing 10 15 lb/bbl Walnut Hulls (M) or 25 gallons Tork Buster Plus. Jet the Shale Pit every 4 hours or as needed to control solids concentration and fluid density. Circulate to move cuttings above BHA prior to connections to reduce packing off and/or stuck pipe. Prior to trips, circulate at least bottoms up to clean hole.
- 5. At TD, pump a low viscosity sweep, followed by a high viscosity sweep, and circulate for minimum of three hours prior to tripping out of the hole for logging and casing operations.

Pursuant to our phone conversation today, I appreciate your help in this matter. We are simply trying to get the C-144 approved prior to our drilling rig moving in this weekend. While we understand that the OCD has to follow a policy in approval of these permits, we seem to be trapped in a quandary. As we understand it, The policy of first in first out is implemented as follows: Lime Rock and Read & Stevens are ahead of Strata After talking to Mike Bratcher and to Randy Hicks, it appears that Hicks engineer is working up an addendum to these permits So these permits ahead of RR Fed 2 are not complete yet and OCD cannot work on our permit until these permits are either approved or denied.

None of these permits have a rig moving on like we do. Our permit was submitted quite some time ago, not just recently.

Therefore, considering all of the above, we respectfully request that you waive this policy, in this case, and allow Mr. Bratcher to approve the permit.

Please let me know if there is anything we can do to resolve this.

Jim,

I have received calls from Randall Hicks and Paul Ragsdale with Strata today, concerning the Roadrunner Fed 2H drilling pit permit. I am sure they have attempted to contact you also. I don't know if you need this, but, as we talked some about, here is a breakdown of where I am at with permits in District 2, in the order of receipt:

- 1. <u>Strata Production</u> Roadrunner Fed 3H/4H Drilling pit permit (3H & 4H are on same location) rec'd 4/18/14. The issue with this permit is that it falls in BLM mapped High cave/karst. My understanding is that this area may be re-mapped by BLM to change the designation to medium or even low. The COA for both of these fed APDs specifies "no pits". At this time, there is no sundry approved or even in process, that I am aware of, to change the COAs. We did receive that type sundry for the Roadrunner 2 this past Tuesday, changing the COA on that well to allow for pits. I have asked for the engineering measures that will be used in an unstable area but haven't seen them yet. Randall indicated today that Pettigrew Engineering was still working on them. The 60 day review period for this permit was up yesterday 6/17/14.
- <u>Read & Stevens</u> Marbob 10H Drilling pit permit. Same issue, high cave/karst, no engineering measures. This one is on State surface and has been denied once for the same reason. It was resubmitted with no changes on 4/22/14. 60 day review period is up 6/21/14. No indication that the karst designation will change.
- LimeRock NW St. 19 Work Over pit rec'd 4/22/14. High cave/karst no indication of designation change – State surface – no engineering measures – 60 day review is up 6/21/14.
- <u>Strata Production</u> Sandy Fed 4H Drilling pit permit. High cave/karst. Fed COA=no pits. This is the other site BLM approved a sundry to allow pits, we received it Tuesday of this week. – 60 day review is up 6/21/14.
- 5. <u>Strata Production</u> **Roadrunner Fed 2** Drilling pit permit rec'd 5/2/14. This is the site that Randall and Strata are calling about. My understanding is the pit has been constructed, lined today and set to spud this Friday. Original Fed COA called for no pits. We rec'd a BLM approved sundry Tuesday to allow pits. This is also in the area that BLM has indicated may change from high cave/karst to medium or low.
- 6. <u>LimeRock</u> All Thorn MWFM Pit rec'd 5/9/14 High cave/karst, no indication the designation will change State surface, etc. 60 days is up 7/8/14.

Randall and I discussed what was needed to approve the permits that are ahead of the Roadrunner 2, weeks ago. We had the same conversation when the first Read & Stevens permit was denied earlier this year. He indicated that the operator would take it to hearing, which I encouraged them to do, but instead, they just re-submitted it. I had a phone call from Debra Hicks w/Pettigrew on 6/10, asking what OCD wanted for the high karst areas, I explained what the rule requires and she indicated that OCD would have what is needed that day. I still don't have it and was told today, it is

still being worked on. I do have a variance request for more time to review, I believe the Roadrunner 3H/4H, but not sure if that can even be approved as a variance.

I will also forward you an email from Paul Ragsdale to Randy Dade, but you may have one similar.
