REMEDIATION WORK PLAN DENIAL - MERLAND SALT WATER DISPOSAL (30-015-22980)

A review of the remediation work plan received by the NMOCD District 2 Office on March 27, 2006 for the Merland Salt Water Disposal (30-015-22980) has been completed by this office. The work plan is being returned for revision subject to the following comments:

- 1. The workplan states, "No visible oil was carried over the berm from Area #1".
 - a. A site visit by NMOCD on March 1, 2006, noted that hydrocarbon staining and pooled hydrocarbons were outside of "Area #1" north of this bermed area.
 - b. Photos taken of this impacted area show native vegetation impacted by hydrocarbons and heavy hydrocarbon saturation to the soils approximately 150 feet north of "Area #1".
 - c. There were also smaller, unsaturated areas of hydrocarbon impact noted behind the tanks, outside the berm and fence line.
- 2. The method of remediation is not appropriate for the contaminants impacting the soils in "Area #2".
 - a. Utilizing fertilizer for promotion of in-situ bioremediation is not consistent with addressing chloride impacted soils, even when hydrocarbons are present. High concentrations of chlorides have been shown to defeat beneficial microbe growth in remediation studies.
 - b. Soil flushing with fresh water provides a mechanism to drive chlorides deeper into the soils without sufficiently diluting the chlorides to provide beneficial protection of ground water. While this flushing may encourage re-growth of vegetation by flushing chlorides from the root zone, it does not remove the risk of the contaminant reaching ground water.
- 3. A full horizontal and vertical site delineation is called for on this release. The extent of the impacted area can only be identified through a full delineation of the impacted area since visible chloride "residues" are not indicative of the full impact extent.

Please submit a revised work plan, addressing the above comments prior to April 20, 2006.
