Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.*

A water hauler reported that the Southern Comfort battery had been struck by lightning. The Production Supervisor arrived on location and observed that two enardo valves at each end of the tank battery were on fire. The Supervisor immediately shut both wells and dispatched the fire department; however, the fires self-extinguished before the fire department arrived.

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.*

The wells were shut-in pending enardo replacement and thorough investigation of the facility prior to bringing the wells back online. There was no release of fluids or impact to the ground or containment.
