Dear Mr. Yarbrough:

I am enclosing herewith two copies of Surveyor's Certificate of staking of location in NENE Sec. 36, Twp. 9 So., Rge. 26 East - Earl G. Levick - Levick/State No. 1 - this well was spudded on August 11th and was drilling ahead on August 12th.

Due to shortage of time it was again impossible for me to go thru your office personally on this application as was the case on the well in 8-27.

For your information the Levick - State #1 in 7-8-27 was drilling at 1765' on August 9th - shut down that evening due to illness of driller and will resume drilling August 14th.

Straightening hole and under-reaming for water shut-off has taken considerable time since the well was spudded on April 19th but contrary to reports I understand have been turned in by the scouts the well has never been shut down for orders. Occasionally there has been a shut down over the week end of an extra day while we were securing additional equipment but other than that the well has been drilling consistently as my drillers reports will show.

It looks to me as if this Chaves County play would get important enough soon to enable you to find an excuse to visit us over here - at least I hope so.
