RE: Shut In Wells

The State of New Mexico is in the process at this time of reviewing leases and determining the number of shut in wells.

Rule 201 A. states "The operator of any well drilled for :il, gas or injection, for seismic, core or other exploration :r for a service well, whether cased or uncased, will be responsible for the plugging thereof."

Rule 201 B. states "A well will be either properly pligger and abandoned or temporarily abandoned in accordance with these rules within 90 days after: (1) a 60-day period following suspension of drilling. (2) A determination that the well is no lower usable for beneficial purposes. (3) A period of one year in which a well has been continuously inactive."

House Bill 65 has been passed by the Legislature and provies a 3.75% tax incentive for wells put back in production. However, if there are no plans to put this well back in service that it needs to either be plugged or properly temporarily abandaned.
