Gentlemen:

On checking Well Record Form C-105 filed on the Honolulu No. 1 State, located in the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 13, T-11-S, R-27-E, Chaves County, New Mexico, we find a few minor omissions in the data furnished. They are as follows:

The 7-inch casing was cemented with 500 sacks of cement with the normal pump-and-plug method through the casing shoe. In order to completely segregate the San Andres oil at 2,000 feet, a bridging plug was set in the casing and four 1/2-inch casing perforations shot at 4,235. Four hundred sacks of cement were pumped through these perforations and a temperature survey run to locate the top of the cement, which was at 2,760. The Casing was re-perforated with four additional holes at 2590 and 390 sacks of cement pumped behind the 7-inch. This cement circulated to the surface. In order to hasten the clean-up of the well after killing it for the above re-cementing, it was re-acidized with 1,000 gallons on March 27, 1950, from 6,490 to 6,563.
