DRILL STEM TEST RECORD

- DST No. 1: 8213 - 8220 (7'). 1" top & bottom chokes on $3\frac{1}{2}$ " drill stem. Tool open 105 minutes. Fair air blow throughout test. Recovered 1200 feet of drilling fluid. No shows oil or gas. Test not positive—leak in drill pipe.
- DST No. 2: 8211 - 8235 (24'). 1" top and bottom chokes on $3\frac{1}{2}$ " drill stem. Tool open 75 minutes. Very slight initial air blow - dead thereafter. Recovered 35' drilling fluid. No shows oil or gas. FBHP 15 psi. 15 min. SIBHP 0 psi.
- DST No. 3: 8214 - 8260 (46'). 1" top and bottom chokes on $3\frac{1}{2}$ " drill stem. Tool open 4 hours. Moderate air blow throughout test. Recovered 540' mud cut salt water. No shows oil or gas. FBHP 300 psi (maximum and final). 15 min. SIBHP 3025 psi.
