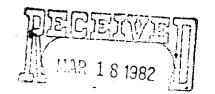

This plan is submitted with Form 9-331C, Application for Permit to Dries Of Variable the above described well. The purpose of this plan is to describe the Potation variable proposed well, the proposed construction activities and operations plan, the magnitude of surface disturbance involved, and the procedures to be followed in rehabilitating the surface after completion of the operations, so that a complete appraisal can be made of the environmental effect associated with the operations.

1. EXISTING ROADS.

Exhibit A is a portion of a county map showing the well and roads in the vicinity of the proposed location. The proposed wellsite is located approximately 32 miles north of Roswell, New Mexico and the access route to the location is indicated in red and green on Exhibit A.

1.	Proceed north from Roswell on Highway 285 for a distance of approximately 27
	miles.
2.	Turn east for approximately 10 miles. The new access road will start here.
PLA	NNED ACCESS ROAD.
Α.	The proposed new access will be approximately 700' in length from point of origin to the southwest edge of the drilling pad. The road will lie in a south to north direction.
В.	The new road will be 12 feet in width (driving surface).
с.	The new road will be bladed with drainage on one side. No turnouts will be built.

- . LOCATION OF EXISTING WELL.
 - A. There is/xixxxxxxx drilling activity within a one-mile radius of the wellsite.
- 4. LOCATION OF EXISTING AND/OR PROPOSED FACILITIES.

The route of the road is visible.

- A. There are/mrex production facilities on this lease at the present time.
- B. In the event that the well is productive, the necessary production facilities will be installed on the drilling pad. If the well is productive oil, a gas or diesel self-contained unit will be used to provide the necessary power. No power will be required if the well is productive of gas.

- 5. Pressure Control Equipment: See Form 9-331C and Exhibit B.
- 6. Mud Program: See Form 9-331C.
- 7. Auxiliary Equipment: Kelly Cock; pit level indicators and flow sensor equipment; sub with full-opening valve on floor, drill pipe connection.
- 8. Testing, Logging and Coring Program:

Samples: Surface casing to TD.

DST's: As warranted.

Coring: None.

Logging: Sidewall nuetron/FDC TD to casing w/GR-sidewall nuetron on to surface, DILL

TD to casing.

- 9. No abnormal pressures or temperatures are anticipated.
- 10. Anticipated starting date: As soon as possible after approval.

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- 5. LOCATION AND TYPE OF WATER SUPPLY.
 - A. It is planned to drill the proposed well with a fresh water system. The water will be obtained from commercial sources and will be hauled to the location by truck over the existing and proposed roads shown in Exhibit A.
- 6. SOURCE OF CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS.

Α.	There	is	no	existing	pit	of	construction	material,	so	none	will	be	used.	

- 7. METHODS OF HANDLING WASTE DISPOSAL.
 - A. Drill cuttings will be disposed of in the reserve pits.
 - B. Drilling fluids will be allowed to evaporate in the reserve pits until the pits are dry.
 - C. Water produced during operations will be collected in tanks until hauled to an approved disposal system, or separate disposal application will be submitted.
 - D. Oil produced during operation will be stored in tanks until sold.
 - E. Current laws and regulations pertaining to the disposal of human waste will be complied with.
 - F. Trash, waste paper, garbage and junk will be buried in a separate trash pit and covered with a minimum or 24 inches dirt. All waste material will be contained to prevent scattering by the wind.
 - G. All trash and debris will be buried or removed from the wellsite within 30 days after finishing drilling and/or completion operations.
- 8. ANCILLARY FACILITIES.
 - A. None required.
- 9. WELLSITE LAYOUT.
 - A. Exhibit C shows the relative location and dimensions of the well pad, the reserve pits, etc.
 - B. The location surface is sand dunes. Cut and fill may be required on location.
 - C. The reserve pits will be plastic lined.
 - D. A 400' \times 400' area has been staked and flagged.
- 10. PLANS FOR RESTORATION OF THE SURFACE.
 - A. After finishing drilling and/or completion operations, all equipment and other material not needed for further operations will be removed. The location will be cleaned of all trash and junk to leave the wellsite in as aethetically pleasing a condition as possible.

- B. Unguarded pits, if any, containing fluids will be fenced until they have dried and leveled.
- C. If the proposed well is non-productive, all rehabilitation and/or vegetation requirements of the Operator-Landowner Agreement will be complied with and will be accomplished as expeditiously as possible. All pits will be filled level within 90 days after abandonment.

11. OTHER INFORMATION.

- A. Topography: The land surface in the vicinity of the wellsite is <u>sand dunes</u>

 The immediate area of the wellsite is discussed above in paragraph

 9B.
- B. Flora and Fauna: The vegetation cover on wellsite consists of mesquite,

 salt cedar and miscellaneous desert growth. No wildlife was observed,
 but the wildlife in the area probably includes those typical of semi-arid desert
 land. The area is used for cattle grazing.
- C. Waterways: The Pecos River is approximately 4 1/2 miles east
- D. There are/are no inhabited dwellings in the vicinity of the proposed wellsite.
- E. Surface Ownership: The wellsite is on federal minerals and private surface.

 The location is on land belonging to Tom Cooper, 410 National Tower, Las

 Cruces, New Mexico, 88001. It was agreed that we would compensate him monetarily for the surface damaged in drilling this well. The pit areas will be leveled after they are dry along with the pad and will be left to reseed naturally.

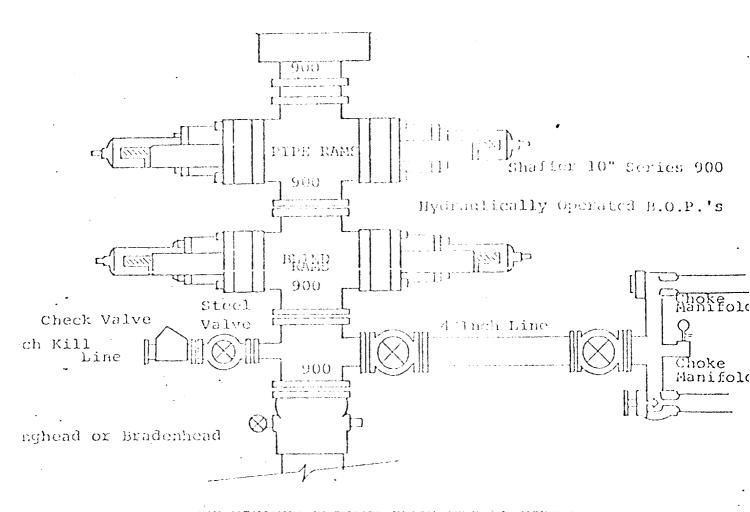

FOLLOWING CONSTITUTE MINIMUM BLOWOUT PREVENTER REQUIREMENTS

All preventers to be hydraulically operated with secondary manual control installed prior to drilling out from under casing.

Choke outlet to be a minimum of 4" diameter.

Kill line to be of all steel construction of 2" minimum diameter.

All connections from operating manifolds to preventers to be all steel. hole or tube a minimum of one inch in diameter.

The available closing pressure shall be at least 15% in excess of that required with sufficient volume to operate the B.O.P.'s.

All connections to and from preventer to have a pressure rating equivalent to that of the B.O.P.'s.

Inside blowout preventer to be available on rig floor.

Operating controls located a safe distance from the rig floor.

Hole must be kept filled on trips below intermediate casing. Operator not responsible for blowouts resulting from not keeping hole full.

D. P. float must be installed and used below cone of first gas intrusion.
