5. FINDINGS: BLM records (Flanary, 12/30/1991) do not indicate the prior recording of sites in Section 13 or Section 24 (T11S, R27E).

Archaeological survey of the well pad revealed the occurrence of 2 Isolated Finds, which do not appear significant past the level of field recording. Data on the isolates occur below.

I.F. # 1: UIM Zone 13; 575,655 m.E; 3,690,985 m.N. T11S, R27E, Section 24, NEt NW1NEt, Chaves County, New Mexico. Elevation: 3745 ft. Situated on an interdunal surface in an area of low coppice dunes. Artifacts: 1 burnt caliche cobble.

I.F. # 2: UIM Zone 13; 576,155 m.E; 3,691,115 m.N. T11S, R27E, Section 13, SEASEASEA, Chaves County, New Mexico. Elevation: 3750 ft. Situated in an area of aeolian deposits adjacent to an extant two-track road. Artifacts: 1 white quartzite, prismatic, interior flake, medial portion $(1.7 \times 1.7 \times 0.4 \text{ cms. thick})$.

6. RECOMMENDATIONS: archaeological CLEARANCE for the Primero Operating Company Marbob Federal Well No. 1 and access road R/W is RECOMMENDED.
