Dear Mr. Glaughter:

With reference to the plugging of the captioned well, we are stating verbatum the method in which it was plugged.

"Filled hole from 2843 - 2650 with heavy red, set a 10-sack cement plug, then filled hole to 1863 feet with mud, shot off and recovered 1570 feet of 8-3/4 inch casing. Filled hole to 1171 feet, set a cement plug in bottom of 10-3/4 inch casing, shot off and recovered 794 feet of 10-3/4 inch casing, set cement plug in top of 10-3/4 inch remaining in hole, leaving the fresh water zone exposed for future use. One joint of 13-inch casing was left in hole and capped with cement and a 4-inch pipe marker erected. Abandonment completed July 25, 1945." The above plugging was done under the supervision of Ralph Hendrickson, Field Superintendent for Stanolind at Hobbs.

In the event you wish to convert this to a water well, please advise Mr. Justin Newman, 205 Booker Building, Artesia, New Mexico. Mr. Newman is a field representative of the Commission in charge of operations in Lincoln County. If you do contemplate converting the Picacho Unit No. 1 to a water well, Mr. Newman will assist you in making the arrangements.
