On Form C-105, on the front side fill in the blanks for important water sands, and casing record. On the back show type of tools used, rotary or cable tools, and fill in the formation record.

On conversion to water well affidavit, complete item #3 by showing size, weight and grade of casing, and if it was cemented, how many sacks. Fill in item #4 and comply with item #5. Then both you and the land owner must sign said form and have it notarized.
