APPLICATION OF SUNRAY MID-CONTINENT
OIL COMPANY FOR A DUALY COMPLETED
OIL PRODUCING AND SALT WATER DISPOSAL
WELL, EDDY COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a.m. on August 30, 1961, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Elvis A. Utz, Examiner duly appointed by the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission," in accordance with Rule 1214 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

NOW, on this 7th day of September, 1961, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the application, the evidence adduced, and the recommendations of the Examiner, Elvis A. Utz, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the applicant, Sunray Mid-Continent Oil Company, seeks permission to dually complete its State "O" Well No. 3, located in the SW/4 SE/4 of Section 12, Township 19 South, Range 28 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil through 2-inch tubing from perforations in the interval from 1763 feet to 2178 feet and to dispose of produced salt water through the 8 5/8 x 5 1/2-inch annulus into the Rustler Anhydrite and Yates formations in the open-hole interval from 386 feet to 884 feet.

(3) That inasmuch as the quantities of salt water to be disposed of through the proposed installation are small, the subject application should be approved.
